A brief summary of the recommendations/ observations of the Committee is given in Appendix (i) and (ii) in respect of Development & Panchayats Department and Implementation of outstanding recommendations/observations respectively. The summary is not exhaustive and for full recommendations or observations of the Committee, reference be made to the main Report and the reports of previous years (for implementation) relating to the Departments concerned.

- 4. The Committee are thankful to the Chief Secretary and Additional Chief Secretary and Principal Secretaries/Secretaries/representatives of the Departments who appeared before the Committee from time to time for their valuable assistance to the Committee.

REPORT

Constitution of the Committee

1. The Committee on Estimates for the year 2024-25 consisting of nine members was nominated by the Hon'ble Speaker, on having been authorized by a motion moved and passed by the Haryana Vidhan Sabha in its sitting held on 22nd February, 2024 and notified vide Haryana Vidhan Sabha Secretariat Notification No. SHS/Committees/2024-25/21, dated 29th March, 2024. Smt. Kamlesh Dhanda, MLA, a member of the Committee was nominated as Chairperson of the Committee by the Hon'ble Speaker which worked upto 12th September, 2024 till expiration of 14th Assembly. Thereafter, after the General Election of 15th Assembly, a new Committee for the remaining period of the year 2024-25 was nominated by the Hon'ble Speaker, on having been authorized by a motion moved and passed by the Haryana Vidhan Sabha in its sitting held on 13th November, 2024 and notified vide Haryana Vidhan Sabha Secretariat Notification No. SHS/15th HVS Committees/2024-25/66, dated 23rd November, 2024. Shri Parmod Kumar Vij, MLA, a member of the Committee was nominated as Chairperson of the Committee by the Hon'ble Speaker.

Sittings

2. The present Committee held/fixed 16 meetings (at Chandigarh and outside Chandigarh) till the finalization of this Report and previous Committee which was constituted on 29th March, 2024 held/fixed 23 meetings during its term.

Implementations/Recommendations

3. The Committee scrutinized the replies received from the Government in connection with the outstanding recommendations/observations made in their reports for the year 1995-96, 2010-2011 and 2021-22, 2012-2013, 2013-2014 pertaining to Public Health Engineering, Excise & Taxation, Irrigation and Water Resources, Environment and Climate Change.

The Committee dropped the recommendations/observations where it was satisfied with the action taken by the Government. The observations of the Committee of the remaining recommendations/observations in respect of these reports are contained in Appendix II of this Report.

Selection of Departments

4. The Committee Selected the following Departments with a view to scrutinize their Budget Estimates for the year 2022-23, 2023-24 and 2024-25: -

- 1. Development & Panchayats Department
- 2. Food, Civil Supplies & Consumer Affairs Department
- 3. Cooperation Department
- 4. Irrigation & Water Resources Department
- 5. Skill Development & Industrial Training Department
- 6. Revenue & Disaster Management Department
- 7. Health Services Department
- 8. Public Works (B&R) Department
- 9. Urban Local Bodies Department
- 10. School Education Department

Scrutiny/Framing of Questionnaire/Oral Examination.

5. The Committee scrutinized the material and framed questionnaire in respect of the Development & Panchayats Department, Haryana for the year 2023-24 and orally examined the representative of the Development & Panchayats Department, Haryana.

The Committee also scrutinized the budget material and thereafter framed the questionnaire in respect of Irrigation & Water Resources Department but could not orally examine the representative of the department as the department failed to supply the replies to the questionnaires framed on the Budget Estimates till the finalization of Report.

The Committee also scrutinized the material relating to the Skill Development & Industrial Training Department, Haryana on the Budget Estimates for the year 2024-25 but not framed the questionnaire due to paucity of time. The Committee also scrutinize the reply to the questionnaire framed by Committee in respect of Food, Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs and Industries & Commerce Departments but could not orally examine the representative of the departments due to paucity of time. The committee also could not taken up the Cooperation department due to paucity of time.

The Committee also could not scrutinized the material relating to the Revenue & Disaster Management, Health Services, Public Works (B&R), Urban Local Bodies and School Education Departments as the departments failed to supply the material on the Budget Estimates till the finalization of Report. Therefore, the Committee took a serious view and recommends that material on Budget Estimates asked by the Committee be supplied at the earliest.

Supplementary Estimates

6. The Committee also scrutinized the Supplementary Estimates of Haryana Government for the year 2024-25 and examined the representative of the Finance Department as well as other Department concerned with the demands and also prepared their reports thereon for being presented to the Vidhan Sabha on the date fixed therefore.

General Observation – Finance Department

7. The Committee while scrutinizing the replies received from the Government relating to the Departments have experienced that material on Budget Estimates, replies to the questionnaires are not being sent by some of the Departments in time in spite of the instructions issued by the Government from time to time.

The Committee is of the view that the Finance Department should coordinate in this respect and reiterate these instructions to all the concerned Department so that replies are sent in time in order to streamline the functioning of the Committee.

Development and Panchayats Department, Haryana is primarily responsible to oversee the implementation of various development schemes in rural areas and also to regulate and coordinate various activities of the Panchayati Raj Institutions.

The Function of Gram Panchayat, Panchayat Samiti, and Zila Parishad as per Haryana Panchayati Raj Act 1994 are given as under: -

SECTION 21. FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES OF GRAM PANCHAYAT

Subject to such rules as may be made. it shall be the duty of the Gram Panchayat within the limits of the funds at its deposal, to make arrangements for carrying out the requirements of sabha area in respect of the following matters including all subsidiary works and building connected therewith.

I. General Functions-

- (1) Every resolution adopted in a meeting of the Gram Sabba shall be duly considered by the Gram Panchayat and the decision and action taken by the Gram Panchayat shall form part of the report of Panchayat of the following year.
- (2) Preparations of annual plans for the development of the Panchayat area.
- (3) Preparation of annual budget and submission thereof to Gram Sabha in its Sawani meeting for consideration.
- (4) Power for mobilizing reliefs in natural calamities.
- (5) Removal of encroachments on public place.
- (6) Organizing voluntary labour and contribution for community works.
- (7) Maintenance of essential statistics of villages(s). -

II. Agriculture, including Agriculture Extension-

- (1) Promotion and Development of agriculture and horticulture.
- (2) Development of waste lands.
- (3) Development and maintenance of grazing lands and preventing their unauthorized alienation and use.

III. Animal Husbandry, Dairying and Poultry.

- (1) Improvement of breed of cattle, poultry and other livestock.
- (2) Promotion of dairy farming, poultry and jiggery
- (3) Grass land development.

IV Fisheries- Development of Fishes in the village(s).

V. Social and Farm Forestry, Minor Forest Produce, Fuel Fodder-

- (1) Planting and preservation of trees on the sides of roads of roads and other public lands under its control.
- (2) Fuel plantations and fodder development.
- (3) Promotion of farm forestry
- (4) Development of social forestry.

VI. Khadi. Village and Cottage Industries-

- (1) Promotion of rural and cottage industries.
- (2) Organization of awareness camps, seminars and training programmes, agricultural and industrial exhibitions for the benefit of the rural areas.

VII. Rural Housing-

- (1) Distribution of house sites within its jurisdiction.
- (2) Maintenance of records relating to the house, site and other private and public properties.

VIII. Drinking Water-

- (1) Construction, repairs and maintenance of drinking water wells, tanks and ponds.
- (2) Prevention and control of water pollution.
- (3) Maintenance of rural water supply schemes.

IX. Buildings, Waterways-

- (1) Maintenance of buildings under its control or transferred to it by the Government or any public authority.
- (2) Maintenance of boats, ferries and waterways.

X. Rural Electrification including distribution of Electricity providing for and maintenance of lighting of public Streets and other public places.

XI. Non-conventional Energy Sources-

- (1) Promotion and Development of non-conventional energy schemes.
- (2) Maintenance of community non-conventional energy devices, including biogas plants and windmills.
- (3) Propagation of improved churl has and other efficient devices.

XII. Poverty Alleviation Programme-

(1) Promotion of public awareness and participation in poverty alleviation programmes for full employment and creating of productive assets including employment assurance scheme.

(2) Selection of beneficiaries under various programmes throughout Gram Sabhas.

(3) Participation in effective implementation and monitoring.

XIII. Education including Primary and Secondary Schools-

(1) Promotion of public awareness and participation in primary and secondary education.

(2) Ensuring full enrolment and attendance in Primary and Middle Schools and its managements.

XIV. Adult and non-formal Education- Promotion of Adult Literacy.

- XV. Libraries- Village Library and reading rooms.
- XVI. Cultural Activities. Promotion of social and cultural activities.
- XVII. Markets and fairs- Regulation of fairs excluding cattle fairs and festivals other than religious.

XVIII. Rural Sanitation.

- (1) Maintenance of general sanitation.
- (2) Cleaning of public roads, drains, tanks, wells and other public places.
- (3) Maintenance and regulation of cremation and burial grounds.
- (4) Construction and maintenance of public latrines
- (5) Disposal and unclaimed corpses and carcasses.
- (6) Management and control of washing and bathing ghats

XIX. Public Health and Family Welfare.

- (1) Implementation of family welfare programme.
- (2) Prevention and remedial measures against epidemics
- (3) Regulation of sale of meat, fish and other perishable food articles.
- (4) Participation in programme of human and animal vaccination.
- (5) Licensing of eating and entertainment establishment.
- (6) Destruction of stray dogs.
- (7) Regulation of curing, tanning and dyeing of skins and hides
- (8) Regulation of offensive and dangerous trades.

XX. Women and child development-

- (1) Participation in the implementation of women and child welfare programme.
- (2) Promotion of child health and nutrition programmes.

XXI. Social welfare including welfare of the Handicapped and Mentally Retarded-

(1) Participation in the implementation of the social welfare Programmes including welfare of the handicapped, mentally retarded and destitute.

- (2) Monitoring of the old age and widows pension scheme.
- XXII. Welfare of the weaker sections and in particular the Scheduled Castes-Promotion of public awareness with regard to welfare of Scheduled Castes and other weaker sections.

XXIII. Public Distribution System-

(1) Promotion of public awareness with regard to the distribution of essential commodities.

- (2) Monitoring the public distribution system.
- XXIV. Maintenance of Community Assets. Construction and Maintenance of Dharamshalas and Similar Institutions.
- XXVI. Construction and Maintenance of Cattle Sheds, Ponds and Cart Stands.
- XXVII. Construction and Maintenance of Slaughterhouse.

XXVIII. Maintenance of Public Parks, Play Grounds etc.

- XXIX. Regulation of manure Pits in Public Places.
- XXX. Other Functions: Such other functions as may be entrusted by the Government or any Local authority.

FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES, OF PANCHAYAT SAMITI

Section 75. (1) Subject to such exceptions and conditions as the Government may by general or special order impose, it shall be the duty of a Panchayat Samiti io provide for and make arrangements for carrying out the requirements of the area under its jurisdiction in respect of the following matters, namely: -

I. General Functions-

(a) Preparation of the annual plans in respect of the schemes entrusted to it by virtue of this Act and those assigned to it by the Government or the Zila Parishad and submission thereof to the Chief Executive Officer within a period of two months of its receipt for the consideration of the District Planning Committee constituted under this Act;

(b) Consideration and consolidation of the annual plans of all Gram Panchayats in the block and submission of the consolidated plan to the Zila Parishad.

(c) Preparation of annual budget of the block and its submission within such time, as may be prescribed,

(d) Performing such functions and executing such works as may be entrusted to it by the Government or the Zila Parishad;

(e) Providing relief in natural calamities.

II. Agriculture, including Agriculture Extension-

- (a) Promotion and development of agriculture and horticulture;
- (b) Maintenance of agriculture seed farms and horticultural nurseries;
- (c) Storing and distribution of fertilizers, insecticides and pesticides;
- (d) Propagation of improved method of cultivation;
- (e) Promotion of cultivation and marketing of grains, vegetables, fruits and flowers.
- III. Land Improvement and Soll Conservation-Assisting the Government and Zila Parishad in the Implementation of land improvement and soil conservation programmes of the Government.
- IV. Minor Irrigation, Water Management and Watershed Development-
 - (a) Assisting the Government and Zila Parishad in the construction and maintenance of minor irrigation works:
 - (b) Implementation of community and individual irrigation works.

V. Animal Husbandry, Dairying and Poultry-

- (a) Maintenance of veterinary and Animal Husbandry Service;
- (b) Improvement of breed of cattle, poultry and other live stock;
- (c) Promotion of dairy farming, poultry and jiggery;
- (d) Prevention of epidemics and contagious diseases.
- VI. Fisheries- Promotion of fisheries development.
- VII. Khadi, Village and Cottage Industries-
 - (a) Promotion of rural and cottage industries.
 - (b) Organization of conferences, seminars and training programmes, agricultural and industrial exhibitions.

VIII. Rural Housing- Implementation of housing schemes and distribution of house sites in villages.

IX. Drinking water-

- (a) Establishment, repairs and maintenance of rural water supply schemes;
- (b) Prevention and control of water pollution;
- (c) Implementation of rural sanitation schemes.
- X. Social and Farm Forestry, Minor Forest Produce, Fuel and Fodder-
 - (a) Planting and preservation of trees on the sides of roads and other public lands under its control;
 - (b) Fuel plantation and fodder development,
 - (c) Promotion of farm forestry

- XI. Maintenance of buildings and property- Maintenance of any building or other property vested in the Panchayat Samiti.
- XII. Non-conventional Energy Sources- Promotion and development of nonconventional energy sources.
- XIII. Poverty Alleviation Programme- Implementation of poverty alleviation programme.
- XIV. Education-
 - (a) Promotion of Primary and Secondary Education;
 - (b) Construction, repair and maintenance of primary schools' buildings;
 - (c) Promotion of social education through youth clubs and Mahila Mandals.
- XV. Technical Training and Vocational Education- Promotion of rural artisan and vocational training.
- XVII. Cultural Activities including Social Education-
 - (a) Establishment of information, community and recreation centers;
 - (b) Organization of ward and watch;
 - (c) Promotion and encouragement of physical, cultural activities, games and sports.
 - (d) Training and utilization of the services of Anganwari Workers and Sanitary Squads.

XVIII. Markets and Fairs- Regulation of fairs and festivals.

XIX. Health and Family Welfare and Rural Sanitation-

- (a) Promotion of health and family welfare programmes
- (b) Promotion of immunization and vaccination programmes.
- (c) Maintenance of health services and control of epidemics;
- (d) Establishment and inspection of Oshdyalya, dispensaries, Unani or Homoeopathic dispensaries, Veterinary Centers and primary Health Centers;
- (e) Carrying out environmental sanitation, health campaigns and educating the public.
 - i) Nutrition
 - ii) Maternity and Child Health,
 - iii) Communicable diseases.
- (f) Ant malarial measures and destruction of locusts, rats and other pests;
- (g) Promoting family welfare activities;
- (h) Health and Sanitation at fairs and festivals

XX. Women and Child development-

- (a) Promotion of programmes relating to development of women and children;
- (b) Promotion of child health and nutrition programmes;
- (c) Promotion of participation of voluntary organizations in women and child development programmes,

XXI. Social Welfare including welfare of the handicapped and mentally retarded-

- (a) Social Welfare programmes including welfare of physically handicapped, mentally retarded and destitute.
- (b) Monitoring the old age and widow's pension and pensions for the handicapped.

XXII. Welfare of the weaker sections and in particular of the Scheduled Castes-

- (a) Promotion of welfare of Scheduled Castes and Weaker sections;
- (b) Protecting such castes and classes from social injustice and exploitation.

XXIII. Maintenance of Community Assets-

- (a) Maintaining all community assets vested in it or transferred by the Government or any Local Authority or Organization;
- (b) Preservation and maintenance of other community assets

XXIV. Public distribution system- Distribution of essential commodities.

XXV. Promotion of Rural Electrification.

XXVI. Co-operation-

- (a) Promotion of co-operation by helping in the establishment and strengthening of service co-operative, industrial, irrigation, farming and other societies;
- (b) Participation in and assistance to service co-operation,
- (c) Providing credit for agriculture purposes.

XXVII. Libraries- Promotion of libraries and reading rooms.

XXVIII. Any other functions entrusted to them.

XXIX. Miscellaneous-

(A) Securing or removing dangerous buildings or places.

(b) Construction, repair and maintenance of relief works, relief houses and other measures of relief on account of famines, floods, earthquakes and natural calamities;

(c) Management of such public ferries as may be entrusted to the charge of Panchayat Samiti under section7-A of the Northern India Farris Act, 1875; Provided that where performance of additional functions of specific duties entrusted to a Panchayat Somit by the Government or the Zila Parishad, has financial implications, the Government or Zila Parishad, as the case may be, shall provide for such financial assistance, if any,

as may to considerately appropriate. The order of the Government or the Zila Parishad in this behalf shall be final.

(2) A Panchayat Samiti may, with the approval or at the suggestion of the Government or the Zila Parishad, provide for and make arrangements for the carrying out of the requirements of the area under its Jurisdiction in respect of any matter not set out in sub-section (1)

DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS OF ZILA PARISHADS DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS OF ZILA PARISHAD

Section 137. (1) A Zila Parishad shall advice, supervise and co-ordinate the functions of the Panchayat Samitis in the district.

(2) Without prejudice to the generally of the provisions of sub-section (1) a Zila Parishad shall have power to-

- (a) give advice to Panchayat Samitis on its own motion or on the requirement of the Government or at the request of a Panchayati Samiti
- (b) co-ordinate and consolidate development plans prepared in respect of Panchayat Samitis
- (c) secure the execution of plans, project, schemes or other works common to two or more Panchayat Samitis in the district,
- (d) exercise and perform such other powers and functions in relation to any development programme as the Government may, by notification, confer on or entrust to it.
- (e) advise Government on all matters relating to development activities and maintenance of services in the district, whether undertaken by local Authorities or Government,
- (f) advise Government on the allocation work among Gram Panchayats and Panchayat Samitis and co-ordinate their work
- (g) advise Government on matters concerning the implementation of any statutory or executive order specially referred to by the Government to the Zila Parishad, and
- (h) examine and approve the budget of Panchayat Samitis in the manner laid down in

(3) The Zila Parishad may, with the prior approval of the Government, levy contribution from the funds of the Panchayat Samitis in the district.

(4) Notwithstanding anything contained to the contrary in this Act, a Zila Parishad shall, when required by the Government to do so, by an order in writing, exercise such supervision and control over the performance of all or any of the administrative functions of the Gram Panchayat and Panchayat Samiti within the district or any part thereof, as may be specified in the said order.

Powers, functions and duties of Sarpanch 1

Section 19. Omitted by Haryana Act 11 of 2007 the Sarpanch shall

- (i) convene meeting of Gram Sabha and Gram Panchayat
- (ii) preside over the meetings of Gram Sabha and Gram Panchayat;

(iii) have the general responsibility for the executive and financial administration of the Gram Panchayat;

(iv) exercise administrative supervision and control over the work of the staff of the Gram Panchayat and the officers and employees whose services may be placed at the disposal of the Gram Panchayat by any other authority, and

(v) for the transaction of business connected with this Act or for the purpose of making any order authorised thereby, exercise such powers, perform such functions and discharge such duties as may be, exercised, performed or discharged by the Gram Panchayat under this Act or the rules made there under

(vi) exercise such other powers, perform such other functions and discharge such other duties as the Gram Panchayat may, by general or special resolution, direct or as the Government may, by rules made in this behalf, prescribe. (2) 11XXXXX]

Powers and functions of Chairman & Vice Chairman of Panchayat Samitis

Section 61. 1. (a) The Chairman shall-

- i) convene, preside over and conduct meetings of the Panchayat Samiti,
- ii) have access to the records of the Panchayat Samiti;
- iii) discharge all duties imposed, and exercise all the powers conferred on him by or under this Act;
- iv) watch over the financial and executive administration of the Panchayat Samiti and submit to the Panchayat Samiti all information connected therewith which shall appear to him to require its orders, and
- v) exercise administrative supervision of the Block Development and Panchayat Officer for securing implementation of resolutions or decisions of the Panchayat Samiti or of any Committee thereof.

(b) The Chairman may in cases of emergency direct the execution or suspension or stoppage of any work or doing any act which requires the sanction of the Panchayat Samiti or any authority thereof and immediate execution or doing of which is, in his opinion, necessary for the service or safety of the public, and may direct that the expenses of executing such work or doing such act shall be paid from the Panchayat Samiti fund Provided that the Chairman shall report forthwith the action taken under this sub-section and the reasons therefore, to any appropriate standing committee at its next meeting. (a) In the absence of the Chairman preside over meetings of the Panchayat Samiti,

(b) exercise such of the powers and perform such of the duties of the Chairman as the Chairman from time to time may subject to the rules made by the Government in this behalf, delegate to him by an order in writing; and

(c) pending the election of Chairman or during the absence of the Chairman, exercise the powers and perform duties of the Chairman.

POWERS AND FUNCTIONS OF PRESIDENT AND VICE-PRESIDENT OF ZILA PARISHAD.

Section 122. (1) (a) The President of Zila Parishad shall:

- (i) convene, preside and conduct meetings of the Zila Parishad
- (ii) have access to the records of the Zila Parishad;
- (iii) discharge all duties imposed and exercise all the powers conferred on him by or under this Act;
- (iv) watch over the financial and executive administration of the Zila Parishad and submit to the Zila Parishad all question connected there with which shall appear to him to require its orders; and
- exercise administrative supervision over the Chief Executive Officer for securing implementation of resolutions or decisions of the Zila Parishad or of any Committee thereof.

(b) The President may in cases of emergency direct the execution or suspension or stoppage of any work or the doing of any act which requires the sanction of the Zila Parishad or any authority thereof, and immediate execution or doing of which is, in his opinion, necessary for the services or safety of the public, and may direct that the expenses of executing such act shall be paid from the Zila Parishad Fund.

Provided that the President shall report forthwith the action taken under this sub- section and, the reasons thereof to the Zila Parishad or any appropriate Committee at its next meetings.

(2) The Vice-President shall: -

(a) in the absence of the president, preside at the meetings of the Zila Parishad;

(b) exercise such of the powers and perform such of the duties of the President, as the President from time to time may, subject to the rules made by the Government in this behalf, delegate to him by an order in writing,

(c) pending the election of the President, or during the absence of the President, exercise the powers and perform the duties of the President.

11. Budget.

After going through the written reply and oral examination of the representative of the department, the Committee recommend that all Panchayats building in every district should be made Model Panchayats Building so that all Government schemes for welfare of the general public can be informed there and training of Sarpanchs & Panchs can be done there in convenient manner.

16. Quality of the works.

The department was asked by the Committee to know the steps taken by the department to cheque quality of the works undertakes by the department.

The Department replied as under: -

- To check quality of works at site Sub Divisional Officer/Junior Engineer incharge of work regularly visit the works and ensure quality and quantity of works at site. Executive Engineers are also making random checking. Frequent sampling is also being undertaken by the department.
- Third Party inspection are conducted by independent agency In which emphasis is given to checking of quality & quantity.
- Works costing more than Rs. 1.00 crore are randomly checked by State Vigilance Bureau with focus on quality.
- Quality Control Register is also maintained by field offices in which on site quality parameters are recorded. Necessary directions have already been issued in this regard.
- Three divisions of Superintending Engineers, Quality Control & Vigilance have been established and entrusted the job of independent quality control and enquiry

After going through the written reply and oral examination of the representative of the department, the Committee recommend that necessary steps should be taken from time to time by department to check the quality of works and Haryana Engineers Works Portal should be used as much possible in department so that transparency can be brought in the works of the department.

17. Facilities provided to the Gram Panchayats and Panchayats Samiti by the department.

The department was asked by the Committee to know the facilities provided to the Gram Panchayats and Panchayats Samiti by the department. The Committee would also like to know the kind of facilities/alternate are providing to the Gram Panchayat where there is no land of Gram Panchayats like pond for drainage, garbage, waste material.

The Department replied as under: -

The facilities provided to Gram Panchayat and Panchayat Samities by the department is enclosed as Annexure 'D' dated 29/12/2023. It is also informed that if any Gram Panchayat having no land like pond for drainage, garbage, waste material the same will be likely to connect adjoining village etc. as under: -

All the Panchayati Raj Institutions and authorities concerned while planning or approving any project shall consider the assignment of functional responsibility of the project as per the above list

After going through the written reply and oral examination of the representative of the department, the Committee recommend that for those Panchayats which do not have their own land for drainage, pond, garbage and waste material, the solution should be found/ made by the department for this either by taking land on lease or by purchasing it so the inhabitant of the panchayats do not face any kind of problem or inconvenience.

18. Illegal possession of Gram Panchayat land.

The department was asked by the Committee to know the steps taken by department to eject the illegal possession of inhabitant of the village from Gram Panchayat Land. The Committee would also like to know the district wise total area of Gram Panchayat land are illegal possessed/constructed by the inhabitant of village.

The Department replied as under: -

In this regard, it is submitted that Section 7 of the Haryana Village Common Lands (Regulation) Act, 1961 provides that the Assistant Collector of the 1st Grade either suo motu or an application made to him by a panchayat or inhabitant of the village or the BDPO or SEPO, after making such enquiry as he may deem fit, eject any person who is in wrong
full and unauthorized possession of the land in shamilat deh. The State Government monitors the progress of the eviction cases pending before the AC 1st Grade from time to time. The State Government has also issued instructions to the Deputy Commissioner/Collector and Assistant Collector of 1 st Grade from time to time. Recently, letter dated 17.03.2023, 01.08.2023, 13.09.2023, 12.10.2023, 23.01.2024 (copy is attached) have been written to the Deputy Commissioners to ensure that the eviction petition are decided in a time bound manner and unauthorized occupation is removed. As per report received from Deputy Commissioner, an area of 28638 Acre 07 Kanal 19 Marla is in illegal possession and similarly an area of 2318 Acre 07 Kanal 14.5 Marla is in illegal possession by constructing pucca structure. District wise detail is attached as under: -

After going through the written reply and oral examination of the representative of the department, the Committee recommend that the department should take steps to remove the illegal possession/encroachment on the Panchayat land as soon as possible and necessary steps required to be taken in this regard so that no one can illegally occupy the department land.

19. Digital Libraries/Gyms.

The department was asked by the Committee to know that as the Government has clearly stated that there will be a provision of 8 to 10 Digital Libraries/Gym in every Constituency of Haryana State, what policy/procedure would be adopted by the Development and Panchayat Department to implement this provision?

The Department replied as under: -

- Development and Panchayats Department has decided to establish e-libraries and Indoor Gyms in existing buildings. A survey was conducted by the department regarding number of existing buildings available in the rural areas of Haryana. Existing Buildings having room/hall of area 600-1000 sq.ft. were identified in which e-libraries are to be established. Existing Buildings having room/hall of area above 1000 sq.ft. were identified in which Indoor Gyms are to be established.
- e-library will be established only in existing buildings. After exhausting such existing buildings, Government may take a call for Construction of e-libraries in New Buildings. e-libraries are to be established in those Gram panchayats who undertake to bear 20% share of total cost of e-libraries. Gram panchayat shall also look after and maintain these assets from its own funds after commissioning of e-libraries. Instructions were issued to field offices memo no. PRC/2023/13713-26 dated 27.06.2023(Annexure '1').
- Government has decided that minimum 10 number existing buildings be identified in each block for setting up of e-libraries & priority shall be given to all those Gram Panchayats for which demand has been received through Gram Darshan portal or during Jan Samvaad. Instructions were issued to field offices vide memo no PRC/2023/18200-211 dated 16.10.2023(Annexure '2').
- For e-libraries: The equipment/ materials such as furniture items are to be procured from Haryana Forest Development Corporation (HFDC), IT items are to be procured by Rate Contract through Supplies and Disposals Department (DS&D),

Books are to be procured through GeM Portal, and Roof Top Solar Power Plant are to be procured by Rate Contract through HAREDA.

For Indoor Gyms: - The equipment/ materials are to be procured by Rate Contract through Supplies and Disposals Department (DS&D) and Roof Top Solar Power Plant are to be procured by Rate Contract through HAREDA.

After going through the written reply and oral examination of the representative of the department, the Committee recommend that the department should encourage the panchayats to open E-Libraries and Gyms in their villages so that the villagers can take full advantage of E-Libraries and Gyms and the future of the villages children can be improved.

20. Scheme tender for the construction of "Barat Ghar".

The department was asked by the Committee to know the village Gharonda of Tiagon Constituency was adopted under Vidhayak Adarsh Nagar Gram Yojna in the year 2019-2020 and under this scheme tender for the construction of "Barat Ghar" has been done twice, but neither the contractors nor the concerned authorities have taken cognizance in this regard. The Committee would like to know as and when this work will be started?

The Department replied as under: -

As per report received from XEN (PR) Faridabad, funds were sanctioned amounting to Rs. 40.97 lakh from Government vide memo no. VAGY-2021/3075 dated 25.02.2021 for Community Centre in village Gharoda and released to XEN (PR) by CEO, DRDA Faridabad vide memo no. 4251/VAGY/FBD dated 19.05.2021. Brief events regarding start of work are as under: -

- Bids were received on re-invitation of tender 3rd time and work was allotted to agency on 29.11.2021. As per contract, cement was to be supplied by department. But the rate contract of cement was not finalized by DGS&D for a long time. Agreement was rescinded due to non-availability of cement.
- Tender was re-invited on 1.10.2022. Acceptance was issued to concerned agency on 26.10.2022, but the tender was cancelled due to failure of agency to deposite the Performace Security.
- Tender was again invited 2 times and now work has been allotted to agency on 21.7.2023.

Now work is in progress and likely to be completed by 30.4.2024.

After going through the written reply and oral examination of the representative of the department, the Committee recommend that the department should try get this work done as soon as possible and the Committee should be informed after the work is complete.

21. Cleaning work of pond.

The department was asked by the Committee to know the two years ago the tender was invited for the cleaning work of pond near Shani Dev Temple in village Tiagon. But despite this, this work of cleaning the said pond has not been started yet. The Committee would like to know as and when this work will be started?

The Department replied as under: -

- The administrative approval amounting to Rs. 71.37 lakhs of Shani Dev Temple Pond was issued by HPWWMA on dated 16.04.2021.
- The bid was received on dated 19.03.2022, when tender was floated 15th time. LOA was issued to agency on dated 26.05.2022. The agency deposited the Performance Security on dated 23.01.2023. Allotment letter was issued on 24.01.2023.
- The grey water of village flows in this pond and it fills up pond during dewatering. The dewatering was been done twice.

Now pond has been divided into two portions. Incoming grey water is diverted in one portion and work has been started in other portion. This work is in progress and is likely to be completed by 31.3.2024.

After going through the written reply and oral examination of the representative of department, the Committee recommend that the department should try get this work done as soon as possible and the Committee should be informed after the work is complete.

22. Tender for the work of drainage and cleaning of water.

The department was asked by the Committee to know in Tigaon Constituency most of the ponds are overflowing. Therefore, the Committee is of the view that through the Ponds Authority, tender for the work of drainage and cleaning of water of these ponds should be made as soon as possible.

The Department replied as under: -

Ponds are taken up for rejuvenation in phased manner. For rejuvenation of ponds, action plan is prepared by HPWWMA. As per PDMS, there are 80 polluted ponds in Tigaon constituency (21 polluted and overflowing + 59 polluted but not overflowing). The ponds are being rejuvenated by PRPW & IWRD as per action plan of pond authority. As per PDMS, till now 35 ponds are taken up in Annual Action Plan (AAP) of HPWWMA (6 to be executed by IWRD and 29 by PRPW).

For execution of work, drawings are being issued by HPWWMA. On the basis of drawings, estimates are submitted to pond authority for approval. After A/A, works are being executed by IWRD and PRPW.

Jind remained on long leave from 8-2-2008 to 3-5-3008 and druing the leave period the official was in jail. The Committee observed that the reply itself contradictory. The Committee noted that it was very much compulsory to suspend an official for the period for which he remained in jail, whatsoever reason is under the relevant provision of the Harvana Civil Services (Punishment and Appeal) Rules, 1987 as was done in the case of Shri Subhash Solanki, Electrician Helper working in the PHE, Division No. 1, Faridabad. After going through the written reply and oral 105 58 33 examination of representative of the Department, the Committee recommends that the Department should take strong action against the persons involve in fake and bogus taxpayer and illegal sale & purchase of goods & liquor. The amount of fine also be recovered from the culprits. The Committee further recommends that the detail report of the action taken with the financial recovery be supplied to the committee at the earliest and Department should taken necessary steps to stop the illegal sale & purchase of goods & liquor. After oral examination of the representative of 106 34 59 Department, the Committee recommends that the fine imposed by the Department should be recovered at the earliest and the complete detail of action taken by the Department be supplied to the Committee and regular checking also be conducted by the Department to stop the illegal sale & purchase of liquor. PUBLIC WORKS (B&R) DEPARTMENT

The Committee has gone through the written reply of the department and during oral examination the representatives of the department the Additional Chief Secretary apprised that HSRDC has executed only deposit works as per the mandate of HSRDC, the Committee further observed that prescribed procedure for payments to the contractors has not been followed in totality and that there are certain procedural lapses in making the payments. The Committee recommends that due procedure of payments be adopted/followed by the department and further desired that details of all works executed by HSRDC which have administrative approval /expenditure of more than Rs.5.00 Cr. be presented in the following proforma.

(i) The Committee has gone through the written reply of the department and during oral examination of the representatives of the Department it was intimated that the roads get damaged due to over loading of vehicles and that the budget for repair of patches/potholes is not often sufficient. The Committee Recommends that the roads leading to quarry zones be constructed with richer specifications so that these are not damaged early.

(ii) Further the Committee observed that the maintenance & amp; upkeep of existing

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infrastructure whether roads or buildings is as important as creating a new infrastructure. The Committee therefore recommends that out of the total annual budget allocated for repair/construction of roads,

a) 1st priority be given to special repair of roads as per road maintenance policy and

b) 2nd priority be given for filing of Pot Hole/Patches and

c) 3rd priority be given for construction of new roads as the State already have a good/adequate road network.

d) Conclusively out of Annual budget for repair of roads, top priority be given to special repair of roads and patch work/pothole repairs be carried out on the 2ndpriority.

(iii) The Committee has also observed that the many roads get damaged even within defect liability period or immediately after the defect liability period is over and special repair on the road is not carried out by the department on the pretext that special repair on the road cannot be carried out as the road has not lived its life as per the Road Maintenance Policy. The Committee, therefore, strongly recommends that

(i) in case these Pot Hole/Patches have come even before defect liability period was over than reasons for such lapses needs to be investigated in detail and responsibility be fixed and appropriate penal action against defaulting contractor/departmental officers be initiated and a detailed action taken report be submitted to the Committee within a month

(ii) in cases where Pot Hole/patches have come after defect liability period, appropriate action for repair/filling of pot holes/patches be taken without any delay so that roads is kept motorable and public at large may not suffer unduly.

The Committee has gone through the written reply of the department and during oral examination of the representatives of the

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Department it was observed that inspection of buildings was not being done periodically and the Committee, therefore, recommends that annual inspection of the all the Govt. buildings be carried out to assess the serviceability of the building and un-serviceable buildings, if any be declared unsafe/condemned to avoid any mishap and further the repair renovation of all Govt. Houses be taken up in a phased manner as per clause 26.5.1 of PWD Code and as per the budget provisions and a detailed action taken report be submitted to the Committee within a month.

111 39-40 (i) The Committee has gone through the written reply of 15 the department and during oral examination of the representatives of the department the committee observed that number of roads lying in poor condition and despite their being necessity for widening of these roads these could not be considered for widening just forest clearance takes a significant time. The Committee therefore recommends that an exercise to identify the roads requiring widening in next five years be undertaken well in advance and in principle approval of Govt. to widen such roads be arranged so as to timely/advance forest clearance. The obtain Committee further desired that the matter be taken up with the Forest Department for speedy clearance of NOC cases so as to facilitate the widening of the roads in time as per the schedule/requirement.

(ii) During oral discussions ACS of Department has intimated that there was no planning wing. The Committee viewed this very seriously that despite total yearly budget of the Department being approximately Rs.40,000/- Cr. but no planning wing existed in the Department. The Committee strongly felt that planning being the foundation of any institution and therefore recommends that a dedicated planning wing be established in the department immediately and planning section of the department needs to be strengthened and a detailed action taken report be submitted to the Committee within a month.

The Committee has gone through the written reply of the department and during oral examination of the representatives of the Department, the Committee observed that there has been cost run in various works as estimated cost of the most of the works increased abnormally even when there was no change in the drawings, site and scope of these works and reply of the department was thus not The satisfactory. Committee therefore. recommends that initial estimates of works be worked out only after proper field survey by taking into consideration all the field conditions like the drawings, scope and site etc are completed and that no changes in scope of work thereafter be allowed without proper prior permission for change in scope is obtained. The Committee further recommends that officer/officials who increased the cost of work without any changes in the scope of work be identified and responsibility be fixed and detailed action taken report be submitted to the Committee within a month.

During oral discussions the Committee has gone through the list of works and observed that a number of works have been delayed much beyond the stipulated date of completion. It was further observed that while some cases of delay were on the part of the department and in other delay was on the part of the agency but surprisingly no penalty has been imposed by the department in any of the work & amp; time extensions were granted to exonerate the contractual agencies. The Committee therefore, recommends that the works be completed timely and due amount of penalty be imposed on the contractual agency on account of delay in completion if any, and that time extensions be

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granted only in cases found to be genuine after thorough investigation of causes of delay.

The Committee has gone through the 114 54 18 written reply of the department and during oral examination of the representatives of the department the Committee observed that a number of works of the agency are lying incomplete incurring despite of huae expenditure which his unfruitful as this developmental work were not being used by public. The Committee therefore recommends that matter be pursued by the ACS to Department of B&R and EIC (Buildings) B&R and a detailed action taken report be submitted to the Committee within a month.

115 54-55 19 During the oral examination of the representatives of the Department the Committee observed that the quality of PMGSY roads was better than State funded roads as the quality control in PMGSY roads is better. It was observed that the maintenance also on **PMGWSY** roads is also better as the contractors were being paid for the maintenance of the roads. The Committee therefore recommends that an effective mechanism for better quality control and maintenance of roads be evolved by the Department and ensured that the width of berms of roads are appropriate and properly maintained.

116 20 56 The Committee has gone through the written reply of the department and during oral examination of the representatives of the Department the Committee observed that no temporary labour has been engaged through Haryana Kaushal Rojgar Nigam Limited. The recommends therefore Committee that necessary arrangement for deployment of temporary labour through Haryana Kaushal Rojgar Nigam Limited as per policy of the Govt. be made and a detailed action taken report be submitted to the committee within a month.

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The Committee has gone through the reply of the department and during oral nation of the representatives of the ment the Committee observed that aint redressal mechanism of the ment was not effective. The Committee ore desired to know detail of all types of aints received during last three years and edressal thereof and recommends that an ve redressal mechanism for prompt al all types of complaints be devised and led action taken report be submitted to the ttee within a month.

The Committee has gone through the written reply of the department and during oral examination of the representatives of the Department the Committee observed that periodical verification of store was not being carried out regularly by the department. The Committee therefore recommends that physical verification of stores be carried out regularly verification of stores be carried out regularly as per prescribed procedure of the department and a detailed action take report be submitted to the Committee within a month.

e Committee has gone through the reply of the department and during oral nation of the representatives of the ment the Committee observed that the ment has quite a large number of vehicles achinery and huge amount was being spent on repair and maintenance of this infrastructure. Committee The therefore recommends that an effective mechanism for optimum utilization of the vehicles and machinery be devised and expenditure on repair and maintenance on this vehicle be minimized. Further, a detailed action taken report be submitted to the Committee within a month.

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The Committee has gone through the written reply of the department and during oral examination of the representatives of the Department, the Committee observed that quite a large number of audit paras are lying pending for want of required corrective/recommended action to be taken by the department. The Committee, therefore, recommends that the required corrective action on all these pending audit paras be initiated/taken promptly as per the recommendation of public Accounts Committee of Vidhan Sabha.

51st Report (2023-24) LABOUR DEPARTMENT

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After going through the written reply and examination of oral representative of department, the Committee observed that the organisation of awareness camp regarding the schemes of department is necessary. Therefore, the **Committee recommends that** the department should expend the allocated budget in time as per instruction of finance department and the department should organize the awareness camps about the schemes from time to time and special provision should also be made in the budget for the awareness camps.

11 13 After going through the written reply and oral examination of representative of department, the Committee recommends that the vacant posts in the department should be filled as soon as possible so that the functioning of the department is not adversely affected due to the vacant posts.
