#### INTRODUCTION

1. I, the Chairman of the Estimates Committee for the year 1975-76 having been authorised by the Committee in this behalf, present this eighth report on the Budget Estimates for the year 1975-76.

2. A brief summary of recommendations/observations of the Committee is given in Appendix I. This summary is not exhaustive, and for full recommendations or observations of the Committee reference should be made to the main Report.

3. A brief record of the proceedings of each meeting has been kept separately in the Vidhan Sabha Secretariat.

4. The Committee are grateful to the representatives of Printing and Stationery Department who appeared before them for oral examination.

5. The Committee place on record their high appreciation of the unstinted co-operation given by the Officers and staff of the Haryana Vidhan Sabha Secretariat.

#### REPORT

1. The Estimates Committee for the year 1975-76 was elected by Vidhan Sabha consisting of nine members and notified vide Haryana Vidhan Sabha Secretariat Notification No, EC-3/75-76/24, dated the 14th May, 1975.

2. Rao Nihal Singh, M.L.A., was nominated Chairman of the Committee by the Hon Speaker

3. The Committee held 25 sittings at Chandigarh, 2 at New Delhi and one each at Calcutta, Darjeeling, Gauhati Kohima and Imphal.

It selected the following Departments for the purpose of scrutinisting their Budget Estimates for the year 1975-76:---

- (1) Dairy Development
- (2) Tourism,
- (3) Sports,
- (4) Treasury and Accounts,
- (5) Printing and Stationery,
- (6) P.W.D. (Public Health), and
- (7) Consumer Cooperative Stores functioning at Chandigarh, Ambala, Faridabad and Hissar.

4 The Committee could not examine the Departments shown at Sr. Nos. 1,2,3,4,6, and 7 due to late receipt of material, nonreceipt of replies to Questionnaire from these Departments and for want of time.

5. The Committee scrutinised the material in support of the Budget Estimates of the Printing and Stationery Department for the year-1975-76 and orally examined the representatives of this Department.

6. The Committee also scrutinised the Supplmentary Estimates of the Government of Haryana for the year 1975-76, (Ist and 2nd Instalments) examined the representatives of the Finance as well as offer concerned Departments with the Demands and submitted their reports thereon to the Vidhan Sabha on the 29th July, 1975 and 19th January, 1976 respectively.

## PRINTING AND STATIONERY DEPARTMENT

#### Functions of the Department

7. The main functions of the Printing and Stationery Department are to meet the the following requirments of all the Departments of the Government -

- (1) to purchase, store and supply the Stationery articles and papers,
- (2) to print and supply forms indented by the various Departments,
- (3) to print priced and un-priced publications, text books and other works, and
- (4) to purchase and undertake services/repairs of type-writers duplicaters and calculaters.

## Organisational set up of the Department

The organisational set up of the Department and its subordinate offices is given here under :---

The Committee noticed from the above statement that a huge amount has been spent for the purchase of spare parts, maintenance and repair during the year 1974-75.

The Committee would like the Department to investigate the reasons for heavy expenditure under the head "Maintenance and repair" and particularly on the purchase of parts. The Committee desire the Department should ensure proper handling of the machinery, through frequent inspection and supervision, so that unnecessary expenditure on this account is saved.

The Committee have noticed from the statement showing the position of staff in the department, (including depots) that there has been a sharp increase of staff during the last 6 years in all categories of posts, particularly in Class III and IV posts. The Committee recommend that the department should have a second look at the strength of the staff and try to curtail it keeping in view the economy aspect.

10. It is one of the functioning of the Department to print and **Printing of torms** supply forms to the Government Departments.

Some of the members informed the departmental representative on the basis of their personal experience that some departments still feel the scarcity of certain categories of printed forms and they do not receive them in time. The committee recommend that in future necessary steps may be taken by the Department to avoid such shortage of forms and to ensure their regular supply.

\*These posts of Typewriter Workshop were reduced after making the scheme as service only.

The committee further recommend that the printed forms be kept at the Book Depots to facilitate the works of Government Departments and for public convenience.

11. The departmental representative informed the Committee **Expension of Govt. Press at Panchkula in order to eliminate private presses from printing work Work UT Press Chandigarh and private presses.** The **figures of printing work got done from outside during the course of oral examination that Haryana Government Press is very small and only 40% work is being done therein. Remaining 60% work has to be got printed in the ratio of 40:20 from U.T Press Chandigarh and private presses.** The **figures of printing work got done from outside during the years 1972-73, 1973-74 and 1974-75 were**

The list of private presses and the amount of printing work got done by them is appended at Annexture 'A'.

In order to eliminate private presses from printing work and to expand the Government Press the Department stated in written evidence as under :—

At the time of re-organisation of erstwhile Punjab no press came to the share of Haryana A nucleus printing press was therefore, set up at Chandigarh in October, 1970 with an investment of about Rs. 15.00 lacs. This press is being run in two shifts and undertaking about 40% of the Government work. With all round increase in the developmental activities in the State, the printing work of the Government departments has increased manifold but there is no possibility to increase the capacity of the existing press due to inadequate accomodation. At the present pace of development, the State Government will, in the next five years, need a printing press at least four times as the one we have at present. This will need nearly 3 acres of land including Publication, Form and Stationery Stores and will tentatively involve an outlay of Rs. 35.00 lacs for land and building and about 60.00 lacs for machinery in order to undertake whole printing work in the Government Press with an annual expenditure of Rs. 20.00 lacs on revenue account for its running in two shifts. At present the printing of Budget, Gazette and bills of Vidhan Sabha are undertaken at U. T. Press, Chandigath and all this work will, therefore, be taken over by the Haryana Government Press. It will however eleminate annual payment of about Rs. 20 lacs at present which is likely to increase in future years with their increased developmental activities from Rs 25 lacs to Rs 30 lacs. annually.

Existing press of Taxt Books at Panchkuia has been established with an outlay of Rs. 10.00 lacs for land and building and Rs. 20.00 lacs for the machinery. This pressis capable of printing about 40% of the total requirements of the text books. In order to obtain self sufficiency in the printing of text books, an additional outlay of Rs. 10:00 lacs for the construction of additional accomodation and Rs. 50:00 lacs of the machinery will be required. A some of Rs. 40:00 lacs have however, been sanctioned by the Planning Department for the fifth five year plan and as such Rs. 20:00 lacs morewill be needed for this purpose with annual running, expenditure, of Rs 8:00 lacs which will eliminite payment to the tune of Rs. 10:00 lacs to the private presses.

The Committee observed that a good deal of printing work has to be entrusted to private presses by the department every year beca, se of its inadequate printing capacity. The committee recommend that the Government should provide the necessary funds for the purpose of expanding the present Printing Press at Panchkula so that the private presses are eliminated from printing work.

The Committee feel that due to non-availability of nationalised text books after the start of academic year, the study of students suffers a lot It also causes set back to the cause of education in the State The Committee recommend that suitable steps should be taken by the Printing & Stationery Department in coordination with the Education Department to make available nationalised text books to the students at the start of the academic year positively and the supplies be maintained throughout the year.

The Committee feel that there should be coordination between the Education Department and Printing and Stationery Department in the matter of printing of nationalised text books Was the Printing and Stationery Department consulted in the instant case before changing the syllabus, if not, the reasons therefor ?

Was the Education department informed that books worth Rs 14670/- in 1972-73 and Rs 22298 in 74-75 were lying un-sold or had the Department investigated in the matter as to why books in excess of anticipated demaned were printed, if so, the results of the same be communicated to the Committee The committee recommend that Printing and Stationery Department should take some remedial measures so that such loss does not take place in future.

The Committee further recommend to the Government that before the syllabus is changed the Education Department should inform the Printing and Stationery Department about this well-in time.

The Committee recommend that responsibility be fixed on the concerned Officers/Officials who placed indents for the printing of publications in question, in excess of the anticipated demands and the Committee be informed accodingly.

The Committee notice that the shortage/excess in the text books papers store, Panchkula is of alarming proportion. The Committee feel that some Store Keeper or petty official cannot dare to commit such grave offence. The Committee have apprehensions that these shortages etc. are the handi work of some big officer. The Committee strongly recommend to the Government that this matter of shortages/excess be got investigated through Vigilance Department and strict disciplinary action be taken against the officers/officials found guilty.

the paper store either at Chandigarh or Panchkula after the Haryana came into being, if so, what was the cause and damage resulted ? Was any enquiry conducted, if so, with what results ?

17. According to Point No. 19 of 20 point programme enunciated Text Books and Stationery etc. to students at controlled rates. by the Prime Minister and to be implemented by the State Government the items of stationery, text books etc are to be made available to the students at controlled rates. The Committee would like to know the action taken by the Department towards implemention of point referred to above, in that, how many stationery stores have been opened for the pupose ; the extent of concessional rates and the No. of students benefitted therefrom.

# IMPLEMENTATION OF COMMITTEE'S RECOMMENDATIONS

18. The Committee held 16 sittings till the finalisation of this Report for scrutinising the statements showing the action taken on the recommendations/observations made in their various Reports.

An up-to-date list of outstanding recommendations/observations from the Reports on the Bubget Estimates of the Punjab Government for the years 1960-61 and of the Haryana Government for the years 1968-69, 1969-70, 1970-71, 1971-72, 1972-73, 1973-74 and 1974-75 is given in Appendix II.

The paragraphs of the Reports and the budget estimates to which the outstanding recommendations relate have only been indicated in Appendix II. For the original recommendations/observations of the Committee, reference may be made to the main Reports. The latest observations of the Committee on the action taken by Government to implement the recommendations, in question, are, however, given in column 4 of the Appendix II.

١

It would be observed from the Appendix II that some of the recomm endations which are still outstanding relate to the Budget Estimates for the years as far as back 1960-61. The Committee feel that their recommendations lose their value if they are not implemented in time or difficulties, if any, experienced by the Government in their implementation are not communicated to them at an early date.

The Committee strongly recommend that immediate action should be taken to implement the outstanding recommendations as given in Appendix II and also those contained in this Report.

A brief summary of recommendations/observations of the Committee in so far as this Report is concerned is given in Appendix I. This summary is not exhaustive and for the recommendations of observations of the Committee reference should be made to the main Report.

It also causes set back to the cause of education in the State. The Committee recommend that suitable steps should be taken by the Printing and Stationery Department in coordination in the Education Department to make available nationalised text books to the students at the start of the acadamic year positively and supplies be maintained throughout the year.

The Committee feel that there should be coordination between the Education Department and Printing and Stationery Department in the matter of printing of nationalised text books Was the Printing and Stationery Department consulted in the instant case before changing the syllabus, if not, the reasons therefor ? Was the Eeducation Department informed that books worth Rs 14670 - in 1972-73 and Rs 22298/- in 74-75 were lying un-sold or had the Department investigated in the matter as to why books in excess of anticipated demand were printed, if so, the results of the same be communicated to the Committee. The Committee recommend that Printing and Stationery Department should take some remedial measures so that such loss does not take place in future. The Committee further recommendio the Government that before the syllabus is changed the Education Department should inform the Printing and Stationery Department about this well in time.

The Committee feel that the indenting Departments should place orders for printing of their publications in Commensurate with realistic requirements. Unplanned printing of publications not only leads to wastage of Government money but also occupies storage capacity on book depots. The Committee recommend that responsibility be fixed on the concerned Officers/officials who placed indents for the printing of publications in question, in excess of the anticipated demands and the Committee may be informed accordingly.

The Committee notices that the shortage/excess in the text books papers store, Panchkula is of alarming proportion. The Committee feel that some Store Keepers or petty official cannot dare to commit such a grave offence. The Committee have apprehensions that these shortages etc. are the handiwork of some big officers. The Committee strongly recommend to the Government that this matter of shortages be got investigated through Vigilance Department and strict disciplanery action be taken against the officers/officials found guilty.

The Committee would like to know whether fire brokeout in the paper store either at Chandigarh or Panchkula after the Haryana came into being, if so, what was the cause and damage resulted ? Was any enquiry conducted, if so, with what results.
