REPORT

Constitution of the Committee

1. The Subject Committee on Food and Supplies for the year 2013-2014 consisting of nine members was nominated by the Hon'ble Speaker, Haryana Vidhan Sabha on 2nd May, 2013 under Rule 276 of the amended Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Haryana Legislative Assembly. Sh Raghubir Singh Tewatia, MLA was nominated as Chairperson of the Committee by Hon'ble Speaker.

(1) The Functions of the Committee are as under -

- (i) to scrutinize the demands for grants,
- (II) to examine the working of these departments and to suggest measures for improvement in administration and in different programmes/schemes /projects;
- (iii) to examine Legislation;
- (iv) to advise Government on a question of policy or Legislation on which Government may consult a Committee;
- (v) to discuss generally and formulate view on -
 - (a) State's Five Year Plane Programmes relating to the departments and their implementation;
 - (b) Reports of Public Undertaking under these Departments,
 - (c) Reports of any statutory or other body, including any Commission of Inquiry, which are laid before the House relating to these Departments and
 - (d) Annual Performance Reports of these departments

(2) The Subject Committee shall not examine or investigate matter of day -to -day administration.

Sittings

2. The Committee held 79 meetings (at Chandigarh and outside Chandigarh) till the finalization of this Report.

Recommendations/Observations

3. The Committee directed the Food & Supplies Department in its meeting held on 14 05.2013 to send a note on the activities of the department. The Committee scrutinized the replies received from the department in connection with the activities and other functions performed by the department. The Committee orally examined the representatives of Food & Supplies Department, Urban Local Bodies Department and Development & Panchayats Department regarding the activities and functions carried by these departments.

The Food & Supplies Department supplied an Action Taken Report (ATR) on the issues raised in the meeting of Subject Committee of Haryana Vidhan

Sabha on Food & Supplies Department held on 18 06.2013. to the Committee The summary of the recommendations/observations of the Subject Committee on Food & Supplies Department are in the Appendix I of this Report

· Scrutiny/Oral Examination

4. The committee received the material related to the activities of the Food & Supplies Department The Committee scrutinized the material and decided firstly to orally examine Food & Supplies Department. Therefore, the Committee held discussions with the Principal Secretary to Government, Haryana and Director General, Food & Supplies Department, Haryana in respect to the functioning of the Department in its meeting held on 18 06 2013

The Committee in its meeting held on 02.07.2013 orally examined the Principal Secretary to Government and Director Urban Local Bodies Department, Haryana regarding issuance of various types of Ration Cards for public distribution system. The Committee further orally examined the Principal Secretary to Government and Director, Development & Panchayats Department in the meeting held on 06 08.2013 regarding the identification of beneficiaries, B.P.L based schemes which come under the B.P.L certificate and other categories.

The Committee again orally examined the Principal Secretary to Government and Director General, Food & Supplies Department, Haryana in respect to the General working of the Department, particularly the Food Security Scheme recently introduced by the department in its meeting held on 24.09.2013. The representatives of the department also submitted an Action Taken Report (ATR) on the issues raised in the meeting of Subject Committee of Haryana Vidhan Sabaha on Food & Supplies Department held on 18.06.2013

5. The Report of the Committee in respect to the Food & Supplies Department are in the following paras .---

FOOD AND SUPPLIES DEPARTMENT

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MAJOR ACTIVITIES

- Procurement of foodgrains under the Minimum Support Price (MSP) 1 Scheme of the Government of India. Proper storage with a view to upkeep the health of procured foodgrains till these are delivered to Food Corporation of ndia (FCI);
- 2. Operation of Public Distribution System (PDS) with special emphasis on Below Poverty Line (BPL), including Antodya Anna Yoina (AAY) Ration Card Holders.
- 3. Maintenance of supplies and securing equitable distribution and availability at fair price of certain essential commodities like Petrol, Diesel and Domestic Gas etc:
- 4. Enforcement of the provisions of the Consumer Protection Act, 1986,
- 5. Enforcement of the Legal Metrology Act. 2009 and
- 6. Enforcement of certain Control Orders issued under Essential Commodities Act. 1955.

OBJECTIVES OF PROCUBEMENT

- To ensure that farmers get remunerative prices for their produce and do not have to resort to distress sale.
- To service the TPDS and other welfare schemes of the Government so that subsidized food-grains are supplied to the poor and needy.
- To build up buffer stocks of food-grains with a view to ensure national . food-grain security

STATE SUBSIDY IN TPDS

- In April, 2005 Government of India imposed a ceiling on number of Antyodaya Anna Yojna (AAY) and Below Poverty Line (BPL) families. As per this ceiling, there can be a maximum of 3.03 lac families under AAY category and a maximum of 4.87 lac families under BPL category.
- The Government of Haryana, however, took a conscious decision in 2008 that people who could not be included in the BPL list, due to imposed ceiling, should also be provided foodgrain at the subsidized rates
- These families, over and above the number fixed for BPL are called State Below Poverty Line (SBPL) families in Haryana. These families are supplied Above Poverty Line (APL) wheat at the rate and scale of BPL beneficiaries.
- The difference in rate is compensated with state subsidy.
- State Government also bears wholesaler's and Fair Price Shop owner's margin along with transportation cost on wheat distributed to AAY families.

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ACTION TAKEN REPORT (A.T.R.)

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ISSUE NO. 1: TIMELY LIFTING OF FOODGRAINS DURING PROCUREMENT AND IRREGULARITIES BY LABOUR & CARTAGE CONTRACTORS.

- Contracts for labour, cartage and transportation for foodgrains procurement on Minimum Support Price (MSP) are made by the procurement agencies during the month of February for the coming Rabi & Kharif seasons. Improvement needs to be made in these areas especially in the mandis and purchase centres.
- It is proposed that Artias Association of mandis and purchase centres may be pursuated to take tenders of these mandis and purchase centres. This way turnwise lifting will be assured and contractors will not be in position to take undue advantage.

(i) After the oral examination of the representatives of the Department, the Committee recommends that latest position of the case of Loharu Anaj Mandi in which weighing machine was found manipulated while checking by a machine specially ordered from Ambala may be provided to the Committee.

(ii) The Committee desired that the Department should make it sure that the lifting of food grains may be carried out by the trucks only not by the tractors and trolleys.

(iii) The committee further recommends that the department should make it sure that the purchasing of food grains may be carried out on that particular day and date of respective purchasing announcement made by the department.

ISSUE NO. 2 : PRIORITY LIQUIDATION OF STOCTS FROM BHAGOLA AND OTHER MANDIS OF DISTRICT PALWAL.

In view of the directions given by the Hon'ble Subject Committee of the Haryana Vidhan Sabha on Food & Supplies Department, special efforts were made for evaquation of stocks from all storage points of Palwal district in general and Bhagola in particular. As a matter of fact, the stock position of Palwal district as on 31.5.2013 was 71881 MT and on 31.8.2013 it was 59861 MT. Upgradation and liquidation were at Bhagola storage point is being taken on priority Due to heavy monsoon this work was delayed for some time and it has been started again

After through the written reply and oral examination of the representatives of the Department, the Committee recommends that the department take prompt action to lift the stocks of food grains from Bhagola and other mandis of District Palwal. The committee further desired that the latest position of liquidation of stock from Bhagola and other Mandis of District Palwal may be provided to the Committee.

ISSUE NO. 3 : PROBLEM OF BARDANA, LESS SPACE IN MANDIS TO ACCOMMODATE ARRIVAL AND FIXATION OF SPOTS TO ACCOMMODATE SURPLUS ARRIVALS.

• Issue to bardana management was handled in the best possible manner during Rabi-2013 and there is sufficient bardana for Kharif-2013 as well.

- Due to shortening of procurement season, there is no alternative but to add more spots where farmers can bring their crop.
- In future it would ne ensured that information about these spots is conveyed to all, well in advance, so that farmers do not have any space problem and their produce is procured as early as possible
- Agencies have already been asked to enter the mandis from 1st of October when Kharif season commences
- Efforts are also being made to educate the farmers to bring their produce as per the uniform specifications of procurement conveyed by the Government of India
- Stocks can be improved in mandis also, where as per the directions of Haryana State Agriculture Marketing Board (HSAMB) all artias should have stocks articles like electric jharnas, pankhas, wooden crates and polythene covers etc.

ISSUED NO. 4 : INCREASE IN COVERED STORAGE CAPACITY

- Total covered capacity n Haryana in 2011-12 was 49.12 LMT
- In 2012-13 it was increased to 65.04 LMT.
- During 2013-14 as on 31 8.2013 (31.8 2013), it increased to 72.40 LMT and an addition of 15.70 LMT is likely to be made during the current year itself.
- So overall covered storage capacity before the beginning of Rabi-2014 season should be around 88.10 LMT.

ISSUE NO. 6 : IDENTIFICATION OF GENUINE BENEFICIARIES IN ANTODAYA ANNA YOJANA (AAY) AND BELOW POVERTY LINE (BPL) CATEGORY.

- The work relating to identification of AAY+BPL beneficiaries is undertaken by Development & Panchayat and Urban Local Bodies Department, Haryana in rural and urban areas respectively.
- The coverage under Targeted Public Distribution System will increase under the National Food Security Act, 2013, from 54.41 lac people to 126.49 lac people.
- As such all needy persons should now be benefitted.

(i) After going through the written reply and oral examination of the representatives of the Department, the Committee recommends that a door to door survey to identify the beneficiaries under B.P.L. category should be done. The Committee further recommends that B.P.L. cards should be issued only to the eligible families.

(ii) The Committee desired that district wise list of those persons who have taken benefits under B.P.L. schemes by giving false information may be provided to the Committee.

(iii) The Committee further recommends to investigate and inquire into the matter of cancellation of B.P.L. cards of Sapera Community in village Nangla in Mohana Block of Prithala assembly constituency. A report of the inquiry may be sent to the Committee.

BASIC INFRASTRUCTURE

- Confed, well equipped with 50 focal points for intermediate storage, operates as wholesale nominee of foodgrains and sugar in the Public Distribution System.
- It ensures doorstep delivery of commodities to FPSs
- There is a sound network of 9174 Fair Price Shops (Urban:2654 + Rural: 6520) in Haryana and no part of the State is uncovered.
- Average ration cards per Fair Price Shops are 640 The average number of effective cards at present per FPS is 140.

REDRESSAL OF PUBLIC GRIEVANCES

- Some representations may be received from some households on account of non inclusion of their names in the list so identified, using guidelines / criteria mentioned above. This may be on account of the individual being absent at the time of SECC survey or the assessment is challenged.
- There are also complaints that some households who presently possess AAY or CBPL or SBPL cards but their name is not included in the list so prepared using SECC Data. Such house holds have been asked to submit declarations only they would continue to get the benefit.
- The list of households/individuals has been given to the Deputy Commissioners for display in the respective villages in rural area and wards in urban area. The individuals who have any claim or objection to the list of identified priority households may submit their claims/objections in writing with full details and reasons within 7 working days to the concerned officer/official so designated by the Deputy Commissioners in their districts, who shall decide the claims / objections after field visit, within 10 working days.
- Any person(s) aggrieved with the orders of such designated officer may represent within 7 working days to the Deputy Commissioner of the district (District Grievance Redressal Officer), who will decide the

representation within 15 working days. Accordingly, deletion/addition would be carried out by concerned the Deputy Commissioner

- Thereafter, the ration cards of the eligible households shall be stamped as 'priority households' based on which they would get foodgrains as per their entitlement provided under The National Food Security Act, 2013 Once the process of identification is complete, new food security cards shall be issued by the Food & Supply Department as per the approved color scheme
- The Deputy Commissioners are at liberty to appoint any number of designated officers in their districts for this purpose, who shall decide the claims / objections strictly as per the guidelines / criteria mentioned above
- The Deputy Commissioners have been asked to personally monitor these activities in their respective districts to ensure that the process of identification is carried out as per the schedule mentioned above
- Proper record of exclusion/inclusion shall be maintained
- The Government has launched this Scheme with effect from 20/08/2013

Observations Page No Sr No. 4 1 After the oral examination of the 41 (I) representatives of the Department, the Committee recommends that latest position of the case of Loharu Anaj Mandi in which weighing machine was found manipulated while checking by a machine specially ordered from Ambala may be provided to the Committee. The Committee desired that the (ii) Department should make it sure that the lifting of food grains may be carried out by the trucks only not by the tractors and trolleys. Committee further The (iii) recommends that the department should make it sure that the purchasing of food grains may be carried out on that particular day respective date of and purchasing announcement made by the department. After going through the written reply 2 41 examination of the oral and representatives of the Department, the Committee recommends that department take prompt the action to lift the stocks of food grains from Bhagola and other mandis of District Palwal. The

Committee further desired that the latest position of liquidation of stock from Bhagola and other Mandis of District Palwal may be provided to the Committee.

- (i) After going through the written reply and oral examination of the representatives of the Department, the Committee recommends that a door to door survey to identify the beneficiaries under B.P.L category should be done. The Committee further recommends that B.P.L. cards should be issued only to the eligible families.
- (ii) The Committee desired that district wise list of those persons who have taken benefits under B.P.L. schemes by giving false information may be provided to the Committee.
- (iii) The Committee further recommends to investigate and inquire into the matter of cancellation of B.P.L. cards of Sapera Community in village Nangla in Mohana Block of Prithala Assembly Constituency. A report of the inquiry may be sent to the Committee.

After going through the written reply and oral examination of the representatives of the Department, the Committee recommends that a notice may be displayed in all the Department Offices containing all the instructions regarding issuing of new Ration Cards. Smart Cards, Duplicate Ration Cards and address change process in Ration Cards along with the time frame according to the Citizen Centric Services.

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- (i) After going through the written reply and oral examination of the representatives of the Department, the Committee recommends that the details of the cases pending in the courts and judgments passed by the court based on the B.P.L. survey conducted in 2011 may be supplied to the Committee.
- (ii) The Committee further recommends that the latest position of cases pending in the State Consumer Protection Commission may be provided to the Committee.

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
