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INTRODUCTION

1. I, the Chairman of the Committee on Government Assurances, having been authorised by the Committee to submit the Report on their behalf, present their First Report.

2. The Committee was nominated by the Speaker, Haryana Vidhan Sabha, under Rule 261 of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Punjab Legislative Assembly on the 2nd August, 1968,—*vide* notification No. CB/PAC/Genl/68/13, dated the 3rd August, 1968.

3. The work done by the Committee after the Re-organisation of the composite Punjab State, i.e., from 1st November, 1966 is set forth in this Report.

4. The Committee also place on record their high appreciation of the whole-hearted co-operation and assistance given to them by the Secretary, Haryana Vidhan Sabha and his staff.

The Committee could not present any report to the House as the Assembly stood dissolved by the proclamation issued by the President of India under Article 356 of the Constitution on the 21st November, 1967.

3. The Committee on Government Assurances for the year 1968-69 consisting of nine Members including the Chairman was constituted by the Speaker, Haryana Vidhan Sabha under rule 261 of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Punjab Legislative Assembly on the 2nd August, 1968,—*vide* notification No. CB/PAC—EC—Genl/68/13, dated the 3rd August, 1968. Chaudhri Mukhtiar Singh was appointed Chairman of the Committee. The Committee held 8 sittings after its constitution.

Position of assurances

Before the reorganisation of the State of Punjab, the position in regard to the assurances given on the floor upto Budget Session, 1965 of the composite Punjab Vidhan Sabha was shown in the 11th Report of the Committee on Government Assurances presented to that House on the 28th March, 1966. A statement showing the number of assurances given on the floor of the composite Punjab Vidhan Sabha upto Budget Session, 1966 before the 1st November, 1966 together with the assurances relating to the areas now forming part of Haryana as also the assurances given during the Sessions of Haryana Vidhan Sabha held in the year 1966, 1967 and 1968 is shown in Appendix I.

Functions of the Committee

The functions of the Committee are to scrutinise the assurances, promises and undertakings etc. given by Ministers from time to time, on the floor of the Assembly and to report on :—

- (a) the number and kind of assurances given and the names of the Ministers and the Department to which they relate ;
- (b) the extent to which such assurances have been implemented ; and
- (c) where implemented whether such implementation has taken place within the minimum time necessary for the purpose.

The main purpose of this Committee is to scrutinise the various assurances given by the Ministers/Deputy Ministers on the floor of the House.

Forms of assurances

The Committee considered the standard list of forms constituting assurances, as approved by the Committee on Government Assurances of Lok Sabha and also incorporated in the 1st Report of the Committee on Government Assurances of the composite Punjab Vidhan Sabha, in its meeting held on the 20th August, 1968 and approved the forms as given in Appendix II to be treated as a guide for extracting assurances.

Scrutiny of assurances

The Committee took up the unfinished work of the Committee on Government Assurances for the year 1967-68 and also scrutinised assurances given by the Ministers on the floor of the composite Punjab Vidhan Sabha upto the Autumn Session 1965 in so far as those related to Haryana State. It also examined the assurances given by the Ministers on the floor of the Haryana Vidhan Sabha during the Budget (March—June) Session, 1967 and Budget (July) Session 1968. The Committee also scrutinised 33 assurances contained in the 11th Report of the Committee on Government Assurances

REPORT

1. The Committee on Government Assurances for the year 1966-67 consisting of five Members including the Chairman was constituted by the Speaker, Haryana Vidhan Sabha under Rule 261 of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Punjab Legislative Assembly on the 9th December, 1966,—*vide* notification No. CB/Genl-2/66/9, dated the 12th January, 1967. Chauhan Devi Lal was appointed Chairman of the Committee. The Committee did not hold any meeting during its tenure and no report was presented to the House.

2. The Committee on Government Assurances for the year 1967-68 consisting of seven Members including the Chairman was appointed by the Speaker, Haryana Vidhan Sabha, under Rule 261 of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Punjab Legislative Assembly on the 21st June, 1967,—*vide* notification No. CB/PAC-EC-Genl-2/67/46, dated the 27th June, 1967. Shri Daya Krishan was appointed Chairman of the Committee. The Committee discussed its functions and held five sittings after its constitution.

The Committee scrutinised the assurances given by the Ministers on the floor of the composite Punjab Vidhan Sabha during the Budget Session, 1966 (before the re-organisation of the Punjab State) in so far as these relate to Haryana State and also examined the assurances given by the Ministers on the floor of the Haryana Vidhan Sabha during the sessions held in December, 1966 as also March-June, 1967 (relating to month of March, 1967 only).

The Committee also examined 1017 assurances printed in the 11th Report of the Committee on Government Assurances of the composite Punjab State for the year 1965-66. Out of these assurances the Committee retained only 234 assurances, 33 were kept pending and the remaining assurances which either lost their utility due to lapse of time or did not relate to Haryana State were dropped by the Committee.

The Committee considered the references received from the Chief Secretary to Government, Haryana, regarding disposal of assurances pending before the 1st November, 1966 as also the assurances given before the dissolution of Haryana Vidhan Sabha on the 28th February, 1967 wherein it was stressed that such assurances should be treated as having been lapsed. The Committee did not agree with the views of the Chief Secretary to Government, Haryana, and the matter remained under correspondence with the Government.

The Committee also considered the recommendations of the 5TH ALL INDIA WHIPS' CONFERENCE held in January, 1966 at Bangalore regarding culling out the assurances by the Department of Parliamentary Affairs. The Committee observed that the present practice of culling out the assurances by the Vidhan Sabha Secretariat as given hereunder should continue :—

"The assurances given by the Ministers/Deputy Ministers on the floor of the House are culled out by the Haryana Vidhan Sabha Secretariat from the debates. A set of assurances culled out is sent to the Chief Secretary to Government, Haryana, for his comments/views. The assurances alongwith the comments of the Chief Secretary, if any, are placed before the Committee for approval. If a particular statement which has been treated as an assurance by the Sabha Secretariat does not in the opinion of the Chief Secretary amount to an assurance, he may represent accordingly to the Committee. The Committee may or may not agree with the comments offered by the Chief Secretary. The decision of the Committee in this regard is, however, final."

The Committee could not present any report to the House as the Assembly stood dissolved by the proclamation issued by the President of India under Article 356 of the Constitution on the 21st November, 1967.

3. 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of the Composite Punjab which were kept pending by the previous Committee. Out of these 33 assurances 24 were dropped, 4 were retained and on 5 further observations were made by the Committee.

The assurances, which were approved by the Committee, after scrutiny, were sent to the Administrative Secretaries concerned for intimating the manner in which and the extent to which the Government have implemented those. Such assurances are contained in Appendix III.

Progress in regard to the implementation of Assurances.

The progress in regard to the implementation of Assurances :—

- (a) contained in the 11th Report (1965-66) of the Committee on Government Assurances of the Composite Punjab Vidhan Sabha and those given on the floor of the Composite Punjab Vidhan Sabha during the Autumn Session, 1965 and Budget Session, 1966 before 1st November, 1966; and
- (b) given on the floor of the Haryana Vidhan Sabha during December Session, 1966 and Budget Session (March-June) 1967 before 21st November, 1967 when the Assembly was dissolved by the President of India by proclamation issued under Article 356 of the Constitution of India was slow.

The Chief Secretary to Government, Haryana, in his U.O. No. 317-Pol(4)-67, dated the 31st January, 1967 / 6th February, 1967 addressed to the Financial Commissioner, Revenue and all the Administrative Secretaries to Government, Haryana conveyed the decision of the Government in relation to the assurances mentioned at (a) above that with the coming into existence of the new state of Haryana all such assurances pending with various Departments might be treated as having lapsed.

In regard to assurances mentioned at (b) above, the Chief Secretary to Government, Haryana, in his letter No. 1894-PPA(2)-67/9642, dated the 2nd June, 1967, expressed the views that as the Committee existing before the dissolution of the Assembly did not present its report to the House regarding the pending assurances which were to be pursued by the successor Committee of the Haryana Vidhan Sabha, so why the assurances held out before the dissolution of the Assembly should not be treated as having lapsed.

The correspondence exchanged between the Chief Secretary to Government, Haryana, and the Haryana Vidhan Sabha Secretariat in this connection is at Appendix IV.

The Committee, after considering the communications received from the Government, did not agree with their view point. The Committee decided to pursue all the pending assurances relating to the State of Haryana and the decision of the Committee was conveyed to the Chief Secretary to Government, Haryana *vide* Vidhan Sabha Secretariat Letters No. CV/A-15/11286, dated the 3rd August, 1967, and No. CB/A-15/67/15444, dated the 2nd November, 1967. The Government did not issue instructions to all the Departments emphasising the need for implementing the assurances in spite of seven reminders including the D.O. reminder issued to the Chief Secretary to Government, Haryana, in this connection. The Chief Secretary to Government, Haryana however, in his U.O. No. 4403-I-68, dated the 18th/19th December, 1968 issued revised instructions to the Financial Commissioner, Revenue and all Administrative Secretaries to Government, Haryana and Heads of Department to the effect that these assurances cannot be treated as having been lapsed and are required to be implemented by the Government.

The Committee are pained to note that the Government kept this matter lurking for about more than one and a half years and did not pursue such an important matter vigorously. The Committee take a serious view of the inordinate delay on the part of the Government which retarded the progress of the work of the Committee.

**Position regarding implementation of Assurances given by the Ministers on
the floor of Punjab Vidhan Parishad relating to the State of Haryana
prior to Re-organisation**

A point was raised before the Committee that the assurances given on the floor of the Punjab Vidhan Parishad relating to the State of Haryana prior to the re-organisation of State of Punjab should also be taken up by the Committee. In accordance with the decision of the Committee no action in the States which were re-organised such as Kerala and Gujarat was ascertained. The Deputy Secretary, Gujarat Legislature Secretariat informed that the Committee on Government Assurances did not *Suo motu* decide to pursue the assurances of the old Bombay State. However, two assurances were forwarded to that Secretariat by Maharashtra State in the year 1963 and the Committee had decided to pursue the same. The Secretary, Kerala Legislative Secretariat informed that the assurances given by the Ministers on the floor of the Madras Legislative Council, which were pending implementation prior to the re-organisation of Madras State, were not pursued by the successor Committee on Government Assurances of the Kerala Legislative Assembly. The Committee noted the contents of the above letters.

**Consideration of replies received from Government Departments in regard to the
implementation of assurances**

The Committee scrutinised 145 replies received from the Government from time to time upto 16th January, 1969 in regard to the implementation of the outstanding assurances contained in the 11th Report of the Committee on Government Assurances of composite Punjab in so far as they related to Haryana State and the assurances given by the Ministers on the Floor of the Composite Punjab Vidhan Sabha upto the Budget Session, 1966 before 1st November, 1966 and also the assurances given by the Ministers on the floor of the House of the Haryana Vidhan Sabha during the Session, 1966 after 1st November, 1966 and the Budget Sessions 1967 and 1968.

The Committee made certain observations in respect of some of the replies scrutinised by them in order to elicit further information from the Government (Appendix III) and noted the rest.

Some of the replies received from the Government could not be scrutinised by the Committee for want of time. These replies and the observations of the Committee thereon will find place in their next Report.

The Committee also decided that the assurances which have either been dropped or in respect of which replies from the Government were noted by it need not be printed in the Report or the Appendix thereto as these have been finally disposed of. The present report has been compiled accordingly.

General observation in regard to implementation of assurances

The Committee observed that certain Departments did not send their replies as to the implementation of assurances in the prescribed proforma together with the requisite number of copies of the replies in spite of the fact that they were specifically asked to do so by the Vidhan Sabha Secretariat with the result that their replies could not be placed before the committee in the proper form and this resulted in not taking an early decision with regard to the implementation of such assurances by the Committee. The Committee accordingly recommend that in future the Departments concerned should see that the requisite number of copies of the information in the prescribed proforma are invariably supplied to the Vidhan Sabha Secretariat in order to facilitate the work of the Committee.

The Committee feel that the value of assurances is lost if they are not implemented and the proper replies sent to the Vidhan Sabha Secretariat in accordance with the Government instructions issued by the Chief Secretary to Government, Punjab, *vide* his U.O. No. 638-P-60, dated the 29th November, 1960 to the Financial Commissioner, Administrative Secretaries and heads of Departments of the Composite Punjab State (as given in Appendix V). Normally the assurances should be implemented by the Government within three months from the date on which those assurances are given. In case it is not possible to implement an assurance within this period the cause of delay should be communicated to the Committee so that it may judge whether the reasons given for the delay are adequate or otherwise. If an assurance is received by an Administrative Secretary who is not concerned with that particular assurance, it should be transferred demi-officially to the Administrative Secretary concerned under intimation to the Vidhan Sabha Secretariat for pursuing the matter with the Administrative Secretary concerned.

Some of the Government Departments simply informed the Vidhan Sabha Secretariat that particular assurance did not relate to them. On the replies received from some of the Departments, it appears that these instructions are not being followed in letter and spirit.

The Committee, therefore, recommend that these instructions should be followed in letter and spirit and fresh instructions may be issued by the Government to Financial Commissioner and all Administrative Secretaries Heads of Departments, on the lines issued previously by the Composite Punjab State Government *vide* Chief Secretary to Government of Composite Punjab State U.O. No. 638-P-6, dated the 29th November, 1960, to impress upon them the desirability of strictly following the same.

The Committee are also of the view that the responsibility of the Government does not end with giving instructions to the various Departments in pursuance of the assurances given on the floor of the House. It should follow up its instructions and satisfy itself that these are carried out meticulously.

The Committee have come to the irresistible conclusion that some of the assurances given several years back have not been implemented by the Government so far. However, the Committee realise that there may be some genuine cases where the implementation of assurances is bound to take a long time because of the various factors involved but that cannot be true in all the cases. The Committee, therefore, recommend that the Government should examine all such cases of assurances which are pending implementation and take necessary steps so that these may be implemented as far as practicable within the period of two months from the date of presentation of this Report.

The Committee also regret to point out that there is a tendency on the part of the Government Departments to give incomplete vague and evasive replies.

In the end, the Committee expect that the Government Departments will take expeditious steps in the matter of implementation of assurances in future.

Will the Financial Commissioner, Revenue, Haryana, and all the Administrative Secretaries to Government, Haryana, kindly refer to the subject noted above ?

2. The Government had under consideration the question of how the assurances held out by certain Ministers on the floor of the Punjab Vidhan Sabha/Punjab Vidhan Parishad prior to 1st November, 1965, are to be disposed of. It has now been decided that, with the coming into existence of the new State of Haryana, all such assurances pending with various Departments may be treated as having lapsed.

Subject :—Assurances pending before the 1st November, 1966.

I am directed to say that the decision of the Government that the Assurances given by the Ministers on the floor of the Punjab Vidhan Sabha prior to 1st November, 1966 be treated as having lapsed, conveyed to the Financial Commissioner, Revenue, Haryana, *vide* your U. O. No. 317-Pol-(4)-67, dated the 31st January, 1967/6th February, 1967 a copy thereof endorsed to this Secretariat, was placed before the Committee on Government Assurances in its meeting held on the 24th July, 1967, which observed as under :—

“The Committee observed that the assurances given on the floor of the House prior to 1st November, 1966, should not be treated as having lapsed, it was, therefore, decided to review the assurances given before the said date and which have been shown as pending in the 11th Report of the Assurances Committee of the Joint Punjab Vidhan Sabha and pursue only those which relate to Haryana State and are of public importance and leave out those which have lost their utility due to lapse of time.”

The above observation of the Committee is based on the following facts :—

- (i) the Government is a continuous institution and promises/assurances/commitments made on the floor of the House by one Government or binding on the successor Government ;
- (ii) the implementation of assurances given on the floor of the erstwhile Punjab Vidhan Sabha prior to integration was pursued by the Committee on Government Assurances of the Punjab Vidhan Sabha ;
- (iii) it is understood that the Assurances Committee of the present Punjab Vidhan Sabha have also decided to pursue implementation of those assurances given on the floor of composite Punjab Vidhan Sabha which relate to Punjab State ;

(iv) the recommendation made by the Estimates Committee and the Public Accounts Committee of the erstwhile Pepsu Vidhan Sabha were pursued by the respective Committees of the Punjab Vidhan Sabha after integration;

(v) the recommendations of the Estimates Committee and the Public Accounts Committee of the Joint Punjab Vidhan Sabha are being pursued by the respective Committees of the Haryana Vidhan Sabha.

I am, accordingly, directed to enclose herewith three copies of the Statement containing the Assurances given by the Ministers on the floor of the Punjab Vidhan Sabha during Budget Session, 1966, which were returned with your endorsement No. 317-Pol.-4-67, dated 31st January, 1967/6th February, 1967 and to request you that the same may kindly be seen by you and returned to this Secretariat with your comments, if any, *within a week*.

This may kindly be treated as *most immediate* as the Committee had decided to scrutinise these assurances in its *next meeting to be held on 19th August, 1967*.

Copy of letter No. 1894-PPA-(2)-67/9642, dated 2nd June, 1967 from the Chief Secretary to Government, Haryana addressed to the Secretary, Haryana Vidhan Sabha.

Subject :—Assurances held out during December, 1966.

I am directed to refer to your letter No. 4816, dated the 29th April, 1967, on the subject cited above and to say that the whole matter has been examined in detail. It has been noticed that previously on a similar point the advice of Lok Sabha Secretariat was sought. A copy of their letter No. 15 (9)/62-Q, dated the 21st September, 1962, is enclosed. Referring to paragraph 2 thereof, it was for the previous Assurances Committee to have sorted out the assurances which were of substantial character and of public importance, and then submitted a report as to which of the assurances should be pursued by the successor Committee of the New House. Since no such decision was taken by the previous Committee and the Ministers who gave the assurances are not in the present Ministry and a few of them may not even have been re-elected, I am to request you to indicate why, in view of the position explained in the Lok Sabha Secretariat letter dated the 21st September, 1962 such assurances should not be treated as having lapsed with the dissolution of the Assembly.

Copy of letter No. 15/(9)/62-&, dated the 21st September, 1962, from Shri B. B. Tewari, Deputy Secretary, Lok Sabha Secretariat, New Delhi, to the Chief Secretary to the Government of Punjab, Chandigarh.

Subject :—Reply to Assembly Questions after the dissolution of the Legislative Assembly.

With reference to your letter No. 5899-Pol-62/18488, dated the 11th September, 1962, on the subject noted above, I am directed to state that in Lok Sabha all pending notices and other business including bills lapse on the dissolution of the House. The interim replies given to questions by Ministers undertaking to supply the requisite information in due course are treated as assurances. Assurances given by Ministers on the floor of the House which are pending implementation by Government are however, deemed not to lapse on the dissolution of the House, if the Committee on Government Assurances has made report to the House that such assurances should be pursued by the successor House *vide* position explained in the subsequent paragraph.

2. In Lok Sabha, implementation of assurances given by Ministers on the floor of the House is watched by the Committee on Government assurances. Before the dissolution of the First and Second Lok Sabha, the Committee on Government Assurances selected from among the pending assurances such of them as were of substantial character

and of public importance and incorporated them in their reports so as to enable the successor Committee of the new House to pursue them. The successor Committee of the New Lok Sabha pursued those Assurances in accordance with the recommendations of the previous Committee. Relevant extracts of paras 3 to 6 of the Fourth Report of the First Lok Sabha and para 3 of the second Report of Second Lok Sabha are enclosed.

Copy of letter No. CB/A-5/66/11615, dated 11th August, 1967 from the Secretary, Haryana Vidhan Sabha addressed to the Chief Secretary to Government, Haryana.

Subject :—Assurances given by the Ministers on the Floor of the House during Session held in (i) December, 1966, and (ii) March, 1967.

In continuation of this Secretarial letter No. CB/ Assurance /5/66-67/8240, dated 5th June, 1967 and No. CB/A-4/66/9721, dated 19th June, 1967, on the subject noted above, I am directed to say that your letter No. 1894-PPA-(2)-67/9642, dated 2nd June, 1967, was placed before the Committee on Government Assurances which observed as under :—

"The Committee observed that the Assurances given on the floor of the House before the dissolution of the Haryana Vidhan Sabha should not be treated as having lapsed with the dissolution of Sabha. It, therefore, decided to scrutinise the assurances given before the dissolution of the Sabha and pursue those which are of substantial character and public importance and leave out those which have lost their utility due to lapse of time".

The above observation of the Committee is based on the following grounds :—

- (i) the procedure laid down in para 1 of the Lok Sabha communication (received with your letter under reference) does not mean that if the Committee on Government Assurances of the dissolved House does not or is unable to make a report to the House that certain Assurances should be pursued by the successor Committee, the Assurances given before the dissolution of the House would lapse ;
- (ii) the suggestions made by the Committee on Government Assurances of the First and Second Lok Sabha (*vide* para 2 of the Lok Sabha's communications) that such assurances be pursued by the successor Committee were merely of a nature of recommendations and were not binding on the successor Committee ;
- (iii) the plea raised that the Ministers who give the assurances before the dissolution of the Haryana Vidhan Sabha are not in the present Ministry and a few of them may not have been re-elected does not appear to be correct as the assurances are given by the Ministers on behalf of the Government and not in their personal capacity.

I am, therefore, to request you kindly to return the sets of assurances given during the Sessions held in December, 1966 and Macrh, 1967 already sent to you, with your comments, if any, so that the same may placed before the Committee for its consideration.

This may kindly be treated as *most Immediate*.

Copy of letter No. 4363-Pol-(4-67)/18202, dated 22nd September, 1967, from the Chief Secretary to Government, Haryana, addressed to the Secretary, Haryana Vidhan Sabha.

Subject :—Assurances pending before the 1st November, 1966.

With reference to your letter No. CB/A-15/11286, dated the 3rd August, 1967, on the subject noted above, I am directed to invite your attention to Haryana Government letter No. 1894-PPA-(2)-67/9642, dated the 2nd June, 1967, with which a

copy of Lok Sabha Secretariat's letter No. 15/(9)62-Q, dated the 21st September, 1962, was forwarded to you. As per advice received from the Lok Sabha Secretariat, assurances given by Ministers on the floor of the House which are pending implementation by Government, are, however, deemed not to lapse on the dissolution of the House, if the Committee on Government Assurances has made a report to the House that such assurances should be pursued by the successor House. It may please be intimated immediately if the Committee on Government Assurances of the composite Punjab, just at the time of re-organisation, had made such a report to the house or not. In case the Assurances Committee had not made such a report to the House, the Assurances given by the Ministers on the floor of the Punjab Vidhan Sabha during budget Session, 1966, should be considered as having lapsed so far as the Haryana State is concerned.

Copy of letter No. CB A-15/67/15444, dated 2nd November, 1967, from the Secretary, Haryana Vidhan Sabha addressed to the Chief Secretary to Government, Haryana.

Subject :—Assurances pending before the 1st November, 1967.

With reference to the correspondence resting with your letter No. 4363-Pol-(4)-67/18202, dated the 22nd September, 1967, on the subject cited above, I am directed to inform you that the matter was placed before the Committee on Government Assurances which did not agree with the views of the Government and felt that it was within its rights to pursue the implementation of all the Assurances pending before the Re-organisation of the Punjab State as well as those given before the dissolution of the Haryana Vidhan Sabha, on the following grounds :—

- (i) Under rule 249 of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Punjab Legislative Assembly, as adopted by the Speaker, Haryana Vidhan Sabha, by virtue of the powers conferred on him under section 19 of the Punjab Re-organisation Act, 1966, 'any matter referred to or pending before a Committee before the appointed day, shall stand referred to or as the case may be, be deemed to be pending before the corresponding Committee after the appointed day ;
- (ii) In paragraph 6 of the 11th Report of the Committee on Government Assurances of the composite Punjab Vidhan Sabha under the head 'Consideration of replies received from Government in regard to the implementation of assurances' it has been stated ;

'Some of the replies received from the Government could not be scrutinised by the Committee for want of time. These replies and the observations of the Committee thereon will find place in their next Report.'

It implies that the Committee on Government Assurances made a report to the House that the assurances, which could not be taken up, should be taken up by the successor Committee.

- (iii) When PEPSU was merged with the Punjab State in 1956, the assurances pending before the Assurances Committee of the Pepsu Vidhan Sabha were pursued by the Assurances Committee of the Punjab Vidhan Sabha after the merger.

So far as the assurances given on the floor of the Haryana Vidhan Sabha before the dissolution are concerned the Committee is of the view that these are not pending notices which would lapse on the dissolution of the Vidhan Sabha. In the past also during the year 1957 and 1962, in the composite Punjab, when the Punjab Vidhan Sabha was dissolved, the assurances given on the floor of the House before dissolution, were pursued by the successor Committee.

It is understood that the Committee on Government Assurances of the present Punjab Vidhan Sabha has also decided to pursue implementation of the Assurances given on the floor of the composite Punjab Vidhan Sabha, and prior to the period of dissolution, which relate to the Punjab State.

I am, therefore, directed to request you to kindly issue necessary instructions to all the Administrative Secretaries to take suitable action for the implementation of all the assurances which were pending before the re-organisation of the Punjab State or were given on the floor of the House before the dissolution of the Haryana Vidhan Sabha.

Copy of U. O. No. 4403-P-68, dated the 18th/19th December, 1968 from the Chief Secretary to Government, Haryana, addressed to the Financial Commissioner, Revenue, and all Administrative Secretaries to Government Haryana, and copies thereof endorsed to all the Heads of Departments and the Secretary Haryana Vidhan Sabha Secretariat.

Subject :—Assurances pending before the 1st November, 1966 and those given before the dissolution of the Haryana Vidhan Sabha.

Will the Financial Commissioner, Revenue and all Administrative Secretaries to Government, Haryana, kindly refer to this Department U. O. No. 317-Pol-(4)-dated 31st January/6th February 1967 ?

2. The question as to whether the assurances pending before the 1st November 1966 and those given before the dissolution of the Haryana Vidhan Sabha in November 1967 are deemed to have lapsed, has been examined afresh in detail. It has now been decided on reconsideration that these assurances cannot be treated as having lapsed and, therefore, are required to be implemented by Government. It is requested that action with regard to the implementation of these assurances may kindly be taken on the above basis as a matter of high priority.

APPENDIX V

Copy of Annexure I of U. O. No. 638 P-60, dated the 20th November, 1960 from the Chief Secretary to Government, Punjab, addressed to the Financial Commissioner, Development, Punjab, Financial Commissioner, Punjab and Financial Commissioner, Revenue Punjab and copies thereof endorsed to all Heads of Departments in the Punjab, the Secretary, Punjab Vidhan Sabha, etc.

Instructions relating to the Committee on Government Assurances.

I. Procedure

The following procedure has been adopted in the matter of implementing and fulfilling Assurances given by Ministers on the floor of the House :—

- (1) The Vidhan Sabha/Legislative Council Secretariat will send a list of assurances pertaining to a particular Administrative Secretary with a covering demi-official letter addressed to the Secretary so that he comes into the picture from the beginning. The receipt of this letter should be acknowledged ;
- (2) The reminders in respect of the outstanding assurances will also be in the form of demi-official letters addressed to the Administrative Secretary concerned. One reminder will relate to one assurance only and will contain a description of the subject matter.
- (3) If an Administrative Secretary is on tour or in a meeting or on leave, the senior most Branch Officer working under him should receive the letters and reminders on the subject of Assurances addressed to the Secretary by name. He should then initiate action without delay and put up such letters to the Secretary for information on the latter's return to office.
- (4) The references relating to the implementing of assurances from the Punjab Vidhan Sabha/Council Secretariat should invariably be acknowledged without any delay ;
- (5) The distribution of Assurances relating to various Branches under the same Administrative Secretary will be the responsibility of the Secretary concerned since the Vidhan Sabha/Legislative Council Secretariat are not always in a position to know the distribution of work in a particular Secretariat ;

- (6) If an Assurance is received by an Administrative Secretary who is not concerned with that particular assurance it should be transferred demographically to the Administrative Secretary concerned under intimation to the Vidhan Sabha/Legislative Council Secretariat who will then pursue the matter with the Administrative Secretary concerned;
- (7) The Administrative Secretary should nominate one of his Branch Officers and a Superintendent for maintaining a record of allocation of the Assurances to the various Branches under him. For convenience this may be as far as practicable, the senior Branch Officer and the senior Superintendent under him.

II. Prompt attendance of references relating to Assurances given by Ministers

The value of the assurances is lost if it is not implemented quickly and the result communicated to the Committee on Assurances. References relating to the implementing of assurances given by the Ministers should therefore be attended to promptly. The Administrative Secretaries should pay personal attention to see that no delay occurs anywhere in the implementing of assurances and should take disciplinary action when necessary.

An assurance should normally be implemented within a maximum period of three months from the date of assurances and where it may not be possible to comply with this requirement a report giving the reasons for the delay should be communicated to the Committee in order to enable them to judge as to how it was beyond the power of the department concerned to implement the assurance within the stipulated period.

In the case of assurances needing correspondence with the Government of India, full facts should be furnished to the Committee that earnest efforts have been made at the highest level to get such assurances implemented and that concrete proposals had been sent to the Government of India.

III. General

- (1) Replies to the assurances should be given to the Vidhan Sabha/Legislative Council Secretariat after obtaining orders of the Minister concerned.
- (2) All the data to be placed before the Committee by a Department should be from the Administrative Secretary and not from the Departmental Heads on behalf of the Government.
- (3) The replies to the assurances should be complete, specific and precise.
- (4) Reply to an assurance concerning more than one Branch should be supplied in a consolidated form by the Branch to whom it is allocated particularly when the Branches concerned are under the same Administrative Secretary.
- (5) Wherever convenient the representative of the Departments should sit together and settle matters after mutual consultation instead of carrying lengthy correspondence in the implementation of the assurances.
- (6) The references relating to the Committee on Government Assurances should be handled carefully. It should be ensured that these references are not lost or mislaid.
- (7) When replies are sent to the Secretariat of the Vidhan Sabha/Legislative Council regarding implementing of assurances the date on which such implementing has taken place should be stated.
- (8) In the case of assurances which cannot be implemented on account of changed circumstances, or otherwise, the Committee should be informed accordingly without any enquiry being made by them. A statement giving reasons should also be made on the floor of the House as soon as practicable.
- (9) Where the information given by a Department regarding implementing of an assurance is considered insufficient by the Committee as to the 'extent' of implementing, further information asked for by the Committee should ordinarily be furnished and all relevant and material information asked for should be promptly supplied. If, however, in the opinion of the Administrative Secretary, any information asked for by Committee is beyond the point, the fact may be brought to the personal notice of the Minister concerned.
