Moreover, we have 2,000 to 2,500 tenants who are interested in getting land. We have got some land and I am glad to say that keeping in view the interest of the poor farmers and tenants the Government have appointed a High-powered Committee to find out a suitable method for solving the problem of ejectment of tenants and the surplus area available by unifying the provisions of the Punjab Security of Land Tenures Act and the Pepsu Tenancy Act on receiving the report of the Committee. I hope we shall be able to take steps in this direction.

The number of eligible tenants awaiting resettlement is 625 and the surplus area available for allotment is 34,000 Sfd. Acres. Steps are being taken to re-settle these tenants also. The Agrarian Reforms Committee has completed its work and its report is likely to become available to Government soon.

The Committee would like to know the latest position in this matter.

(Further Observation)
The Committee would like to have village-wise break-up of 647 eligible tenants and of 35,301 standard acres of surplus area available for resettlement. The Committee would also like to know as to what was the hitch in resettling the eligible tenants over this surplus land. The implementation of this important assurance has already been very much delayed. The Committee, therefore, stresses upon the urgency of implementing this Assurance expeditiously. The Committee feel that the reply of the Government is evasive. The Committee would further like to know whether the report of the Agrarian Reforms Committee has been made available to the Government.

I want to assure the House that we have made such rules and regulations regarding Nazool land that this land may be distributed amongst Harjians and utilised properly.

Allotment of nazool land was stopped in October, 1967. Thereafter no land was allotted. In June, 1969, the matter was reconsidered and it was decided that the available nazool land should be given to Harjians in accordance with the existing instructions, i.e., Nazool Lands (Transfer) Rules, 1956. Accordingly, all the D.C.s. in the State were addressed and they have allotted 278 acres of land to the eligible persons from July, 1969 to December, 1970. They have been asked to allot the remaining land also to eligible persons immediately.

The Committee would like to know (1) the total area of Nazool land available in the State on 1st November, 1966; (2) the number of allottees to whom 278 acres of Nazool land has been allotted up to December, 1969; (3) the reasons for delay in allotting the remaining Nazool land to the eligible persons; and (4) the number of applications received from the eligible persons for the allotment of Nazool land, up-to-date.

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Unfortunately, there has not been much response to this incentive. Efforts will be made to surplus area as soon as the recommendations of the Agrarian Reforms Committee are received.

(Further observation)

The Committee orally examined the departmental representative in their meeting held on 22nd December, 1969 and decided to postpone this assurance. The departmental representative assured that the final decision of the Government with regard to Crop Insurance Scheme would be communicated within two months.

The Scheme of Crop Insurance is very complicated and requires a good deal of detailed statistical data for its formation on sound lines. This data is being collected. Also for the implementation of the scheme suitable legislation is necessary. According to the Constitution only Parliament is competent to pass this legislation. A draft Crop Insurance Bill together with detailed note for the implementation of Crop Insurance Scheme has been prepared and submitted to the Ministry of Food and Agriculture for getting the Bill passed by the Parliament. In the mean time the requisite information to work out the details of the scheme is being collected.

It is hoped that the Crop Insurance Act will be available this year and it may be possible to start the insurance of crops by Kharif, 1964.

In regard to the cases pending in the Courts of Law, every effort is made by the departmental officers to pursue them in the Law Courts through the District Attorneys, etc. It will, however, be appreciated that whatever the Department may do, the Courts of Law will take their own time to dispose them of according to the procedure of law and any effort by the departments/Government stressing upon the Law Courts for their expeditious disposal will have little effect. Still efforts are being made through the prosecuting agency to expedite these cases.

Prolonged consideration of the matter was necessitated by the fact that a number of Departments such as Finance, Local Government, Excise and Taxation Development Departments had to be consulted. Final decision in the matter by the Finance Department is likely to take quite some time more. One aspect of this question, namely, rationalisation of tax structure of urban lands and properties which at present are subject to House Tax, property Tax and Marla Tax was recently referred to by Government, to a Committee Known as Non-Agricultural Land Taxation Committee which has submitted its report in 1965. The Examiner, Local Fund Ac-
counts was requested to get the
accounts of the Municipal Com-
mittee, Sohnā audited in detail.
The relevant record was sealed by
the District Development and
Panchayat Officer, Gurgaon at the
time of enquiry. On 28th July,
1965, seven members of the
Municipal Committee represented
to Government that the special
audit involved expenditure of
Rs 10,000 and it was difficult for
the Municipal Committee to
bear this burden. This plea was
not accepted by Government.
Audit reported embezzlement of
Rs 854.13 and suspected mis-
appropriation of Rs 317.41 besides
tampering with of the record.
The Examiner, Local Fund
Accounts suggested that the cases
of embezzlement be reported to
police for investigation. For one
year the expenditure of audit
worked out to be Rs 2,865. It
was decided that in view of heavy
cost of audit fee, audit should
be conducted only for the cases
in respect of which specific com-
plaint(s) of embezzlement had
been made. It was also decided

Chief Minister (Rao Birendra Singh) ordered that the matter should not be got investigated through the police, the record should be returned to the Municipal Committee and departmental enquiry should be held. The Deputy Director, Local Bodies (Regional) Rohitak held an enquiry. He suggested taking stern action against the defaulting municipal employees, under intimation to him to ensure that adequate action was taken. This was approved. From the Enquiry Report, when the case came to the notice of the present Local Government Minister, he found that as many as twenty moharrirs were involved in these nefarious activities and the Municipal Committee had let them off with simple warning and a fine of a few rupees, saying that it was not a fit case of handing it over to the police. Government was not satisfied with it. It was decided that action should be taken against the guilty officials. Audit of the accounts for subsequent years was also ordered. It was also decided that the allegations against the officials should be got probed through the police. The police reported that there was no cognizable offence and the case was registered with the police. The Municipal Committee, Sohna was superseded on 12th May, 1969. The latest position is that the Deputy Commissioner, Gurgaon has been asked to hold the departmental enquiry in the matter and send report to Government for further necessary action.
