House that we have made allotment of nazool land was stopped in October, 1967. There know, (1) the total area of Nazool such rules and regulations after no land was allotted. Tenant from distant places are not inclined to shift to villages where surplus area is available. In order to find a solution for this paradoxical situation and other matters relating to land reforms, Government had constituted an Agrarian Reforms Committee on 12th November, 1968. Its report is expected shortly. Further reforms will be carried out on the basis of the recommendations of the Agrarian Reforms Committee. If any landowner had disposed of any surplus area, it has no meaning. Government will treat it as surplus and utilise it for allotment to tenants. If a vendee has purchased surplus area, he has purchased it at his own risk.

The Scheme of Crop Insurance is very complicated and requires a good deal of detailed statistical data for its formation on sound lines. This data is being collected. Also for the implementation of the scheme suitable legislation is necessary. According to the

Constitution only Parliament is competent to pass this legislation. A draft Crop Insurance Bill together with detailed note for the implementation of Crop Insurance Scheme has been prepared and submitted to the Ministry of Food and Agriculture for getting the Bill passed by the Parliament. In the mean time the requisite information to work out the details of the scheme is being collected.

It is hoped that the Crop Insurance Act will be available this year and it may be possible to start the insurance of crops by Kharif, 1964.



Out of the amount of Rs 30 lacs provided for credit facilities, a sum of Rs 29,99,150 has not been spent. An amount of Rs 13.50 lacs earmarked for underwriting was proposed to be utilised through H.S.I.D.C. during the year, 1968-69. Out of this, an amount of Rs 5 lacs has since been transferred for the purpose. The balance amount was not transferred to the Corporation as the State Government on re-appraisal decided not to give funds to the

and being encouraged to set up new industrial units of generous offers of financial assistance and other incentives. Mahendergarh and Gurgaon have mineral potential and an outlay of Rs 3.50 lakhs has been earmarked for its exploration.

Corporation as Government considered that the same were not required by the Corporation immediately.

An amount of Rs 6 lakhs, has been spent for setting up a Co-operative Spinning Mills. The site at Bhawani and Muthal has since been selected by the Site Selection Committee. To attract 'Industrial projects to rural areas, Government have further decided that in the case of live-stock-based, agro-based and mineral basis industries where the project involves a capital investment exceeding Rs 5 lakhs and set up in the rural areas. Towns with a population up to 15,000 the same concessions/incentives will be available as are given at the focal points.

A provision of Rs 3.5 lakhs was made in the Annual Plan for the year 1968-69 for the development of Mines and Minerals of the State. The following 5 schemes were sanctioned for the implementation of the programme :—

- (1) Mineral Exploration work.
- (2) Ground Water Unit.
- (3) Geo-chemical and chemical units.
- (4) Drilling operation unit.

(5) Mineral conservation scheme.

All these schemes have been put on ground.

In District Mohindergarh detailed exploration for Iron ore and marble deposits has been carried out by the Department, by means of extension drilling. The iron ore reserve proved up till now is more than 4 million tonnes. Further areas are being probed by means of prospecting and drilling. The Geological Survey of India has already conducted geo-physical survey in the Alluvium covered areas and have given indication that there is possibility of mineralized zone below the soil cover.

Regarding the marble deposits, extensive survey is being conducted by the Industrial Development Corporation and at present one block viz., Khala has been prospected by means of extensive drilling. Further work is in progress.

III. Durgapur Coalfield (West Bengal)
has been conducted for the re-vital salt industry in Sultanpur Farrukh Nagar. A scientist of Central Salt Marine and Chemical Research Institute, Bhavnagar has been consulted and with his guidance an experiment was conducted by lining Polythene sheets to check up the percolation of brine. It has been found very useful. It has been proposed to set up a Salt Demonstration-cum-production farm in the said area.

Clay investigation in District Gurgaon is also in progress

The revenue received from the minor/major mineral has increased manifold in these districts and has gone more than Rs 4 lakhs per annum by means of granting contracts and mining leases. The overall revenue of these State from mines/minerals is about Rs 10 lakhs.

(In the aforesaid letter, dated the 23rd August, 1966, it was also decided that there will be no reservation for Scheduled Castes/Tribes and other Backward Classes in appointments made by promotion to a Class II or a higher service or post whether on the basis of seniority-cum-fitness, selection or competitive examination limited to departmental candidates.) However, the above instructions were modified.—*vide* Haryana Government circular letter No. 2480-SW&BC-67/22979, dated the 10th August, 1967, clarifying that in the case of Class III and Class IV ap-

pointments in grades or services to which there is no direct recruitment, whatever, there will be reservation of vacancies at 20 per cent for Scheduled Castes/Tribes and 2 per cent for Backward Classes in promotions made by (i) selection or (ii) on the results of competitive examinations limited to departmental candidates and further that there will be no reservation in appointments made by promotion on the basis of seniority subject to fitness. This was done in order to bring these instructions strictly and in conformity with the method and procedure being followed by the Government of India. 

It was decided that in view of heavy cost of audit fee, audit should be conducted only for the cases in respect of which specific complaint(s) of embezzlement had been made. It was also decided that in respect of the embezzlements already pointed out by the Audit the "case" should be reported to the police. This was done on 9th June, 1967, the then

Chief Minister (Rao Biendra Singh) ordered that the matter should not be got investigated through the police, the record should be returned to the Municipal Committee and departmental enquiry should be held. He suggested taking stern action against the defaulting municipal employees under intimation to him to ensure that adequate action was taken. This was approved. From the Enquiry Report, when the case came to the notice of the present Local Government Minister, he found that as many as twenty moharris were involved in these nefarious activities and the Municipal Committee had let them off with simple warning and a fine of a few rupees saying that it was not a fit case of handing it over to the police. Government was not satisfied with it. It was decided that action should be taken against the guilty officials. Audit of the accounts for subsequent years was also ordered.
