2. The Committee were nominated by the Speaker, Haryana Vidhan Sabha under Rule 261 of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Punjab Legislative Assembly on the 6th September, 1972,—*vide* Gazette notification No. EC-3/72-73/39, dated the 7th September, 1972.

3. The work done by the Committee after the presentation of the Third Report on the 12th February, 1971 is set forth in this Report.

4. The Committee also place on record their high appreciation of the whole-hearted co-operation and assistance given to them by the Secretary, Haryana Vidhan Sabha, and his staff.

REPORT

1. The Committee on Government Assurances for the year 1971-72 consisting of nine members including the Chairman were constituted by the Speaker, Haryana Vidhan Sabha,—*vide* notification No. CB/EC-3/71/39, dated the 5th May, 1971. Shri Mangal Sein was appointed as Chairman of the Committee. The Committee held 39 sittings after its constitution.

SCRUTINY OF ASSURANCES

2. The Committee scrutinised the assurances given on the floor of the House during the Budget Session held in February, 1971. The statement which in the opinion of the Committee constituted assurances were sent to the Administrative Secretaries concerned for intimating the manner in which the Government had implemented them. The Committee could not scrutinise the statement of assurances given on the floor of the House during the Session held in August, October, and November, 1971 and during the Session held in January, 1972 for want of time.

3. The Committee scrutinised the replies received from the Government from time to time in regard to the implementation of the assurances shown as outstanding in Appendix II of the Third Report as also the replies containing the action taken by Government to implement the assurances given on the floor of the House during the Session held in February, 1971. The Committee made certain observations in respect of some of the replies scrutinised by them in order to elicit further information from the Government (Appendix II) and dropped the rest

Position regarding implementation of assurances given by the Ministers on the floor of the Punjab Vidhan Parishad relating to State of Haryana prior to Re-organisation.

4. The Committee decided not to pursue the assurances given by the Ministers on the floor of the Punjab Vidhan Parishad prior to re-organisation of the Punjab State. The concerned administrative Secretaries to Government, Haryana, were informed accordingly. In view of this no further action is required to be taken on those assurances.

5. The Committee reviewed the assurances appearing in Appendix II of the Third Report. The Committee dropped some of the assurances which lost their utility due to lapse of time.

6. Consequent upon the dissolution of the Haryana Vidhan Sabha with effect from the 21st January, 1972, the Committee could not present any Report to the House.

7. The Committee on Government Assurances for the year 1972-73 consisting of nine members including the Chairman were constituted by the Speaker, Haryana Vidhan Sabha under rule 261 of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Punjab Legislative Assembly on the 6th September, 1972,—*vide* notification No. EC-3/72-73/39, dated the 7th September, 1972. Chaudhri Manphul Singh was appointed as Chairman of the Committee. The Committee held 20 sittings after its constitution.

SCRUTINY OF ASSURANCES

8. The position in regard to the assurances given on the floor of the House up to the Session held in August, 1970 of the Haryana Vidhan Sabha was shown i

the Third Report of the Committee which was presented to the House on the 12th February, 1971. A statement showing the number of assurances given on the floor of the House during the Sessions held in February, 1971, August, October, November, 1971, January, 1972 and April, 1972 is given in Appendix I.

The Committee took up the unfinished work of the Committee on Government Assurances for the year 1971-72 and also scrutinised the statement of assurances given by the Ministers on the floor of the House during the Sessions held in August, October, November, 1971, January, 1972 and April, 1972. The statements which in the opinion of the Committee constituted assurances were sent to the Administrative Secretaries concerned for intimating the manner in which and the extent to which the Government had implemented them. The Committee could not scrutinise the statement of the assurances given by the Ministers on the floor of the House during the Session held in August—October, 1972 for want of time. The successor Committee may scrutinise the same.

Consideration of replies received from Government in regard to the implementation of Assurances.

9. The Committee scrutinised the replies received from the Government from time to time up to the 15th February, 1973, in regard to the implementation of the outstanding assurances. The Committee made certain observations in respect of some of replies scrutinised by them in order to elicit further information from the Government (Appendix II) and dropped the rest. The replies received from the Government after the 15th February, 1973 may be taken up by the successor Committee.

The assurances which have either been dropped because they had outlived their utility due to lapse of time or in respect of which the Committee were satisfied with the action taken by the Government to implement them have not been printed in this Report.

10. The Committee reviewed the outstanding assurances appearing in Appendix II of the Third Report. The Committee after further reviewing the assurances dropped some of them. The assurances which have been dropped in this process have not been reprinted in this report. The Government Departments may, therefore, not send replies to those assurances which do not find place in this Report.

General Observations in regard to implementation of Assurances.

11. The Committee in their First Report recommended that—

“Normally the assurances should be implemented by the Government within three months from the date on which those assurances are given. In case it is not possible to implement an assurance within this period the cause of delay should be communicated to the Committee so that it may judge whether the reasons given for the delay are adequate or otherwise”.

The above recommendation was reiterated by the Committee in their Second and Third Reports. The Committee are pained to point out that their above recommendation is still not being followed in letter and spirit. The Committee observe that the value of the assurance is lost if it is not implemented quickly and the result communicated to the Committee. References relating to the implementation of assurances given by the Ministers should, therefore, be attended to promptly. The Administrative Secretaries should pay personal attention in the matter to see that no delay occurs anywhere in implementing assurances and should take disciplinary

action where necessary. The Committee further observe with regret that a large number of assurances given by the Ministers on the floor of the House from time to time have not been implemented as would be seen from Appendix II of this Report.

In spite of repeated observations made by the Committee in their previous Reports, certain departments still do not supply their replies as to the implementation of assurances in the prescribed proforma together with the requisite number of copies (16) in spite of the fact that they are specifically asked to do so by the Vidhan Sabha Secretariat. It is hoped that in future the Department would supply the requisite number of copies (16) in the prescribed proforma to facilitate the work of the Committee.

The Committee in their First Report observed as under :—

“The Committee also regret to point out that there is a tendency on the part of the Government Departments to give incomplete, vague and evasive replies”.

The Committee reiterated above recommendation in their Second and Third Reports also. The Committee, however, regret to observe that in spite of their repeated said recommendation, the replies received from some of the departments are incomplete, vague and evasive. The Committee disapprove this attitude adopted by some of the departments. It is hoped that in future replies received from all the departments would be complete, specific and precise to the points.

The previous Committee made the following observation in their Second Report :—

“While going through the record of the Vidhan Sabha Secretariat, the Committee have come to know that some of the Departments asked for copies of the Vidhan Sabha Debates, or copies of old questions. Generally these assurances are self-explanatory. The Committee suggest that in case any difficulty is experienced about the details of particular proceedings, the relevant debate may be consulted. The date of debate has been given against each assurance. The Committee further suggest that if need be the Department may depute their own officials to make out copies from the Library of the Vidhan Sabha Secretariat to expedite action in the matter.”

The Committee have observed that in spite of their above suggestion certain departments still ask for the detail of questions, etc., instead of deputing officials of their Departments. The Committee once again suggest that if need be the Departments may depute their own officials to make out copies from the Debates from the Library of Vidhan Sabha Secretariat to expedite action in the matter.

The Committee feel that generally cyclostyled copies of the replies sent by the Government Departments, particularly those sent in Hindi, are illegible, and the Committee, therefore, desire that the Government should issue instructions to the Administrative Secretaries to Government, Haryana, and all heads of Departments to the effect that the cyclostyled copies should have clear impression and should be legible.

After going through record of Vidhan Sabha Secretariat, the Committee observe that the Administrative Officers at Secretariat level request their subordinate offices for the supply of requisite information in connection with the implementation of the Assurances but the subordinate offices do not supply information to the departmental headquarters which generally results in delay in the implementation of the

assurances. This shows loose control by the Administrative Departments on their subordinate offices. The Committee, therefore, recommend that some time-limit should be fixed for supplying the requisite information from the subordinate offices and in case that is not forthcoming within that prescribed period, the Government should take action against the officers/officials responsible for the delay.

The Assurances given by the Ministers on the floor of the House during each Session of the Vidhan Sabha are forwarded to the Administrative Secretaries concerned with covering demi-official letters in accordance with the procedure laid down by the Chief Secretary. In the interest of expeditious disposal of work pertaining to this Committee all communications from the Government Departments intimating the action taken to implement the assurances should indicate the references of the demi-official letters with which those were forwarded to the Administrative Secretaries.

Typical cases of inordinate delay

The Committee have come across cases where inordinate delay has occurred in taking action to implement the outstanding assurances. Some of the cases are cited below :—

(i) Panchayats Department

The following assurance (Assurance No. 39 of Third Report) arising out of supplementary to Starred Question No. 9734 by Shri Har Kishan regarding recovery from the ex-Sarpanches was given by the Deputy Minister on the floor of the composite Punjab Vidhan Sabha on the 29th March, 1966 :—

“Action is being taken and recovery would be made as soon as possible.”

The said assurance was forwarded to the Commissioner for Agricultural Production and Rural Development and Secretary to Government, Haryana, Panchayat Department,—*vide* Vidhan Sabha D.O. letter No. CB/A-28/67/14344, dated the 28th September, 1967. The Committee are pained to note that no reply to the assurance under reference has been received even up till now in spite of reminders issued by the Vidhan Sabha Secretariat from time to time.

(ii) Industries Department

The following assurance (Assurance No. 235 of the 11th Report of the Committee on Government Assurances of the Composite Punjab Vidhan Sabha—Now Assurance No. 125 of Third Report of the Committee on Government Assurances of the Haryana Vidhan Sabha) arising out of reply to general discussion on the budget regarding establishment of college on the pattern of Maharashtra to impart Technical Training to the staff of Newsprint factory was given on the floor of the House of the composite Punjab Vidhan Sabha on the 11th March, 1965 :—

“We are going to establish a college on the pattern of Maharashtra to impart Technical Training to the staff of Newsprint factory.”

The said assurance was forwarded to the Department by the Punjab Vidhan Sabha Secretariat. The Committee on Government Assurances of the Haryana Vidhan Sabha decided to pursue the assurance in question and the Secretary to Government, Haryana, Industries Department was informed accordingly,—*vide* letter No. CB/A 67/67/15605, dated the 7th November, 1967. The Committee regret to note that the Department has not moved at all into the matter even after a period of about 5 years and the assurance which was given about eight years back still remains unimplemented.

(iii) Labour Department

The following assurance (Assurance No. 692 of the 11th Report of the Committee on Government Assurances of the composite Punjab Vidhan Sabha—Now Assurance No. 166 of the Third Report of the Committee on Government Assurances of the Haryana Vidhan Sabha) arising out of Unstarred Question No. 2489 by Comrade Jangir Singh Joga and Comrade Babu Singh Master regarding bringing hotels and their managements under the Minimum Wages Act was given on the floor of the composite Punjab Vidhan Sabha on the 24th March, 1965 :—

“Action to constitute an Advisory Committee for this purpose is being taken.”

The said assurance was sent to the Department by the Punjab Vidhan Sabha Secretariat. The Secretary, Labour and Employment, Punjab,—*vide* his letter No. 10061-2LABI-66/25542, dated 6th September, 1966 replied as under with reference to the said Assurance :—

“It has been decided to keep pending the proposal to constitute an Advisory Committee for employment in hotels and tea stalls under the Minimum Wages Act, 1948 till re-organisation of the State.”

After coming into being of the State of Haryana, the Committee decided to pursue the assurance in question and the Secretary to Government, Haryana, Labour Department was informed accordingly,—*vide* Haryana Vidhan Sabha Secretariat letter No. CB/A-73/67/15617, dated the 7th November, 1967. The Committee while considering the reply of the Labour Department, Punjab, in regard to the implementation of the said Assurance observed that the latest position in the matter be supplied to them and the Secretary to Government, Haryana, Labour and Employment Department was informed accordingly,—*vide* Vidhan Sabha Secretariat Memo No. CB/A-73/67-69/12889, dated the 11th November, 1968. Since then no reply has been received in respect of the assurance under reference. The Committee take a serious view of the inordinate delay involved in this case.

(iv) Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes Department

The following assurance (Assurance No. 943 of the 11th Report of the Composite Punjab Vidhan Sabha—Now Assurance No. 178 of the Third Report of the Committee on Government Assurances of the Haryana Vidhan Sabha) arising out of supplementary by Chaudhri Amar Singh on Starred Question No. 6906 by Chaudhri Khurshed Ahmed regarding giving advance to Harijan tenants who wanted to purchase land of the landlords was given on the floor of the House of the composite Punjab Vidhan Sabha on the 10th March, 1965 :—

“I am not aware but I will certainly find it out.”

The said assurance was forwarded to the Department by the Punjab Vidhan Sabha Secretariat. The Committee of the Haryana Vidhan Sabha decided to pursue the assurance under reference and the Secretary to Government, Haryana, Welfare of Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes Department was informed accordingly,—*vide* Vidhan Sabha Secretariat letter No. CB/A-82/67/15633, dated the 7th November, 1967. What to speak of sending final reply intimating to the Committee the action taken by the Government for the implementation of the said assurance, the Department has not shown the courtesy expected of it to send an interim reply. The Committee are constrained to draw an irresistible conclusion that the Department has not attached due importance to the Committee's work.

(v) Home Department

The Assurance (Assurance No. 207 of the Third Report) arising out of Starred Question No. 8702 by Comrade Shamsher Singh Josh regarding Civil Defence Measures given by the Deputy Minister on the floor of the House of the Punjab Vidhan Sabha on the 22nd November, 1965, is given below :—

“Details are being collected from the Central Emergency Relief Training Institute, Nagpur on the lines of which the Civil Defence Training Institute is to be set up in the State.”

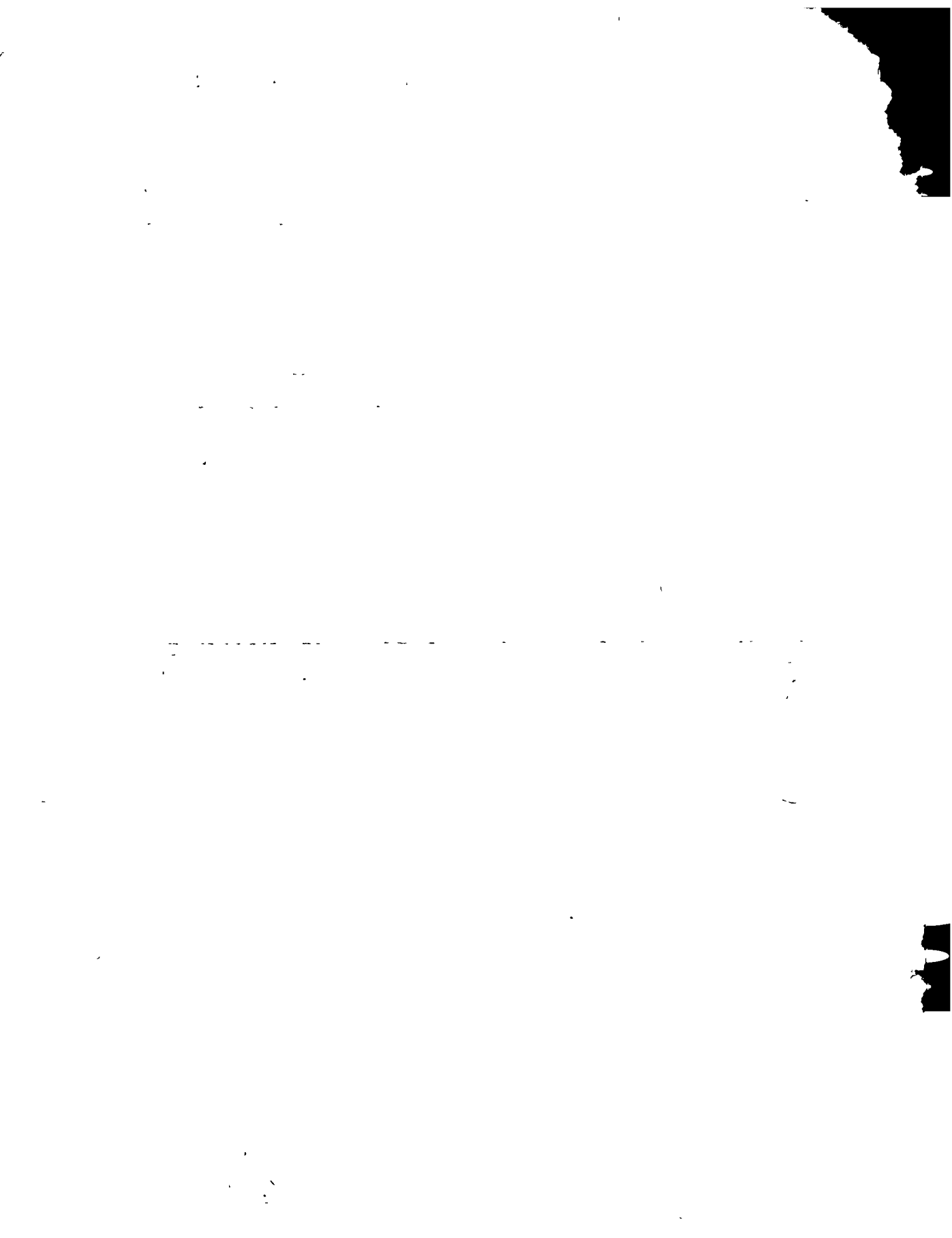
The said assurance was forwarded to the Commissioner for Home Affairs and Secretary to Government, Haryana, Home Department,—*vide* Vidhan Sabha Secretariat D.O. letter No. CB/A-98/67-68/9388, dated the 2nd September, 1968. The Department has not intimated any action taken to implement the Assurance up to the writing of this report.

The cases of some employees are pending with the courts and will be disposed of after the same are decided by the courts. The remaining cases will be decided as early as possible.

The Government has actually started the scheme for insuring crops in the State. For this purpose the Government obtained the service of an experience officer. Actually of the Life Insurance Corporation of India to serve as the Crop Insurance Adviser) to Punjab Government for one year

The officer had originally prepared a draft report for the Government of India regarding problems of crop and cattle insurance in India. This officer remained with the Punjab Government from July, 1961 to July 1962. The Government also obtained the services of a Japanese Expert on Crop Insurance from the F.A.O., who remained with the Punjab Government from September, 1961 to February, 1962. The Government have also appointed a skeleton staff for the formation of the Crop Insurance Scheme. The details of the scheme are being worked out.

The Scheme of Crop Insurance is very complicated and requires a good deal of detailed statistical data for its formation on sound lines. This data is being collected. Also for the implementation of the scheme suitable legislation is necessary. According to the Constitution only Parliament is competent to pass this legislation. A draft Crop Insurance Bill together with detailed note for the implementation of Crop Insurance Scheme has been prepared and submitted to the Ministry of Food and Agriculture for getting the Bill passed by the Parliament. In the mean time the requisite information to work out the details of the scheme is being collected.

It is hoped that the Crop Insurance Act will be available this year and it may be possible to start the insurance of crops by Kharif, 1964.

Note — The Committee decided to orally examine the departmental representatives after they had scrutinised the latest position.

However, the above instructions were modified,—*vide* Haryana Government circular letter No. 2480-SW&BC-67/22979, dated the 10th August, 1967, clarifying that in the case of Class III and IV Class appointments in grade or services to which there is no direct recruitment, whatever, there will be reservation of vacancies at 20 per cent for Scheduled Castes/Tribes and 2 per cent for Backward Classes in promotions

made by (i) selection or (ii) on the results of competitive examinations limited to departmental candidates and further that there will be no reservation in appointments made by promotion on the basis of seniority subject to fitness. This was done in order to bring these instructions strictly and in conformity with the method and procedure being followed by the Government of India. The question of further modifying the above instructions so that there should be reservation of vacancies irrespective of the fact whether promotion is made by a selection or on the results of competitive examinations or on the basis of seniority subject to fitness, and whether or not there is a provision for direct recruitment is now under the consideration of Government and a copy of the instructions to be issued in this connection will be supplied shortly.

The implementation of the remaining five schemes of nationalisation has been slowed down, because the State Government has to give a hearing again to

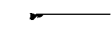

The Audit Report relating to the Pepsu Chief Minister's Flood Relief Fund showing details of the money advanced out of this Fund to M.L.A.'s and Schools, etc., were received by the Government in November, 1959. Necessary action regarding adjustments is being taken on the basis of that report. A further communication on the subject will follow in due course

No further communication in the matter has been received from the Government

(Further Observation)

The Committee regretted to note the failure of the Department concerned to supply the information asked for by them earlier and desired that it should now send the requisite information without any further delay explaining thereby the reasons for the delay in compliance thereof

*(Further Observation)**(Reply to Observation)*

Since the adjustments of the Pepsu Flood Relief Fund Accounts have not been finally settled, interim replies were sent regularly to the Secretary, Punjab Vidhan

The Committee would like to know the steps contemplated or taken by the Government when the persons concerned are not sending their replies despite

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repeated reminders from the Government

Sabha. Interim reply was sent in the prescribed *pro forma* with the Department Memo No. 4WGI-7(1)-63/19042, dated the 11th September, 1964, as desired by him. Thus the matter is under active consideration of Government.

The amounts out of the Chief Minister, Pepsu's Flood Relief Fund were advanced mostly to M.L.A.'s, ex-M.L.A.s and their relatives or certain Committees. Despite repeated reminders their final replies are not forthcoming in some cases. Efforts are being made to get these accounts settled as early as possible, thereafter a final reply to the assurance will be sent.

The Committee would also like to know whether the Government has considered the disability of taking any legal action in the matter

The assurance in question arose out of reply to supplementary question by Sardar Atma Singh whether the advances made to the Deputy Commissioners, Schools and M.L.As, had been adjusted and accounted for. The reply sent by the department in this regard does not satisfy the Committee. It is true that no audit objection on this subject is pending with the Government. The Committee are hardly concerned with this. Their function is to see whether the assurance given on the floor of the House has been implemented in letter and spirit. After going through the reply sent by the department,

the Committee feel that much remains to be done in this behalf. They are, therefore, not satisfied with the reply that it has not been possible for the department to trace out the papers relating to the areas now forming parts of the Haryana State. The department should muster hard to get hold of the relevant record and send a satisfactory reply to the Committee. Further, the main emphasis was on the balance of Rs 91,000 regarding which information has not been sent. The reply sent by the department only speaks for an amount of Rs 35,000 and for that even it has not been made clear whether it has been adjusted and accounted for. The Committee do not feel inclined to drop the assurance and desire that this may be fully implemented and the action taken by the Government in this behalf be intimated to them at the earliest

2. The Punjab Government had been processing this case for full ten years. At the time of Reorganisation of States in 1966, no record regarding these advances in so far as Haryana areas were concerned, was handed over to Haryana Government. In spite of best efforts, it has not been possible at this stage to trace out the papers relating to Haryana area either from the present Punjab Government or from the Central Records. The State Government, therefore, request that the assurance may kindly be deleted.

No audit objection on this subject is pending with Government *Prima facie*, this assurance pertains to pre-reorganisation period and concerns the new State of Punjab.

(Further Observation)

There is some confusion about the figure of Rs 91,000 mentioned by the Committee and the figure of Rs 35,000 mentioned by the Haryana Government in their letter No. 4779-3PP-70/26743, dated 9th September, 1970. As would be seen from the Punjab Vidhan Sabha debate, dated the 20th February, The Committee orally examined the representatives of General Administration Department on 10th September, 1971 and the representative of the Department promised to supply an extract from the Audit Report relating to Shri Ram Saran Chand Mittal and Shri Jagan Nath, Headmaster,

1958 (copy obtained from the Haryana Vidhan Sabha Secretariat Library) a sum of Rs six lakhs is stated to have been collected for the Flood Relief Fund, out of which Rs five lakhs had been spent, leaving a balance of Rs 91,000. A perusal of the Original assurance would show that the assurance given was for the details of the money advanced to M.L.As and to Schools and its adjustments and not to the devolution of cash balance of Pepsu Chief Minister's Flood Relief Fund to the successor State of Post 1st November, 1956 Punjab.

(2) So far as the details of money advanced to M.L.As, etc., are concerned, the files available in the present Punjab State as well as in the old Central Record have been searched but complete papers are not traceable. It has, however, been possible to locate one file in which Maj. Amir Singh rendered account of Rs 5,000 advanced to him from this Fund and the Government on 17th August, 1956 approved the adjustment of this amount

From discussions with the officials of Punjab Civil Secretariat, it transpires that similar action in respect of other cases have also been taken and the only outstanding advances pertain to the districts of Bhatinda and Sangrur, for which the matter is being pursued by the Punjab Government with the respective Deputy Commissioner. It would thus be seen that it is not feasible for the Haryana Government to reopen these cases at this

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stage and they, therefore, request that the assurance may kindly be deleted

The relevant records were not easily available. The most important file No C(66)-A/C-1955-Volume II, was not made available and is alleged to have been lost. The result of examination of the accounts incorporated in the succeeding paragraph is, therefore, restricted to the records which were made available after a good deal of correspondence for over a year

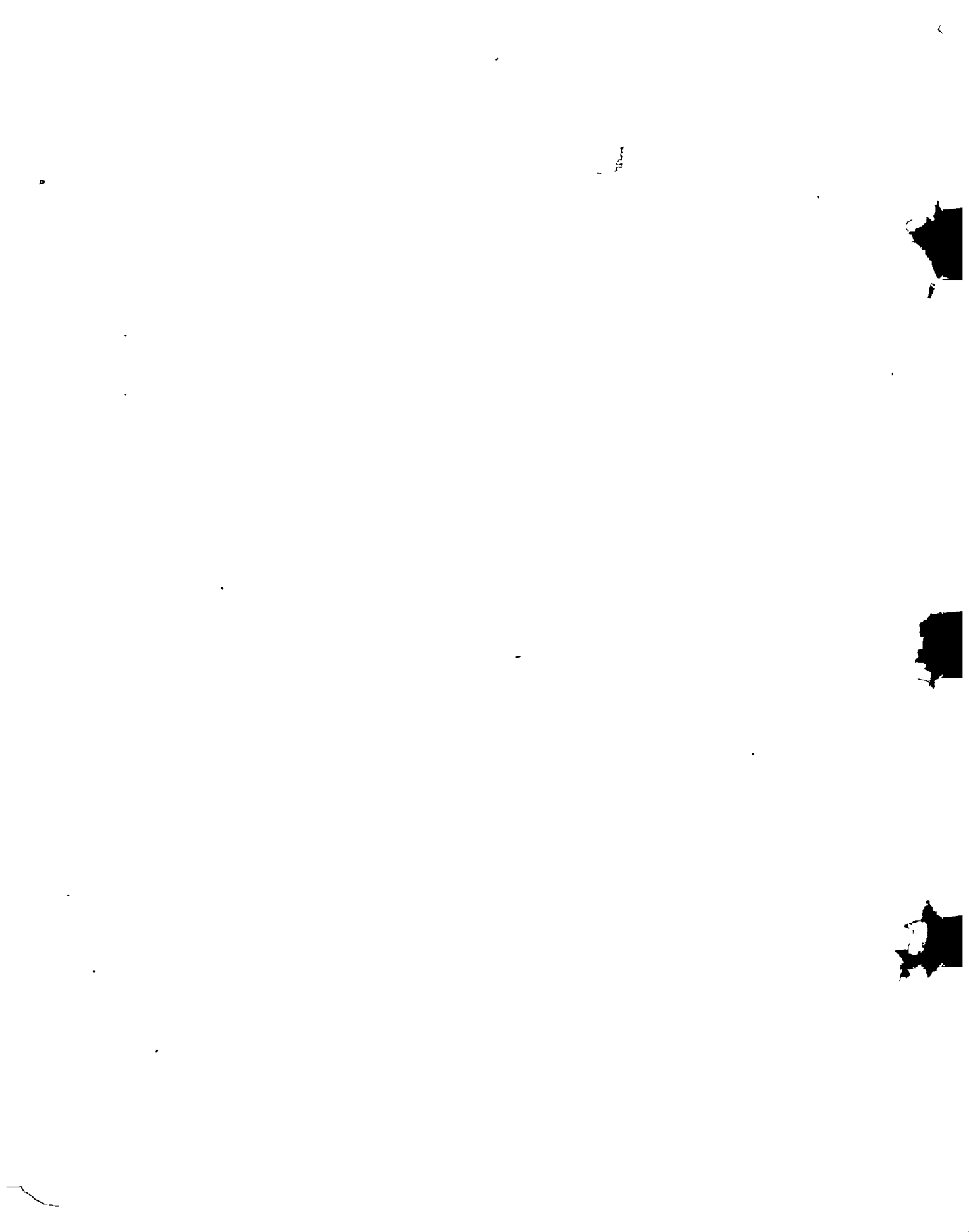

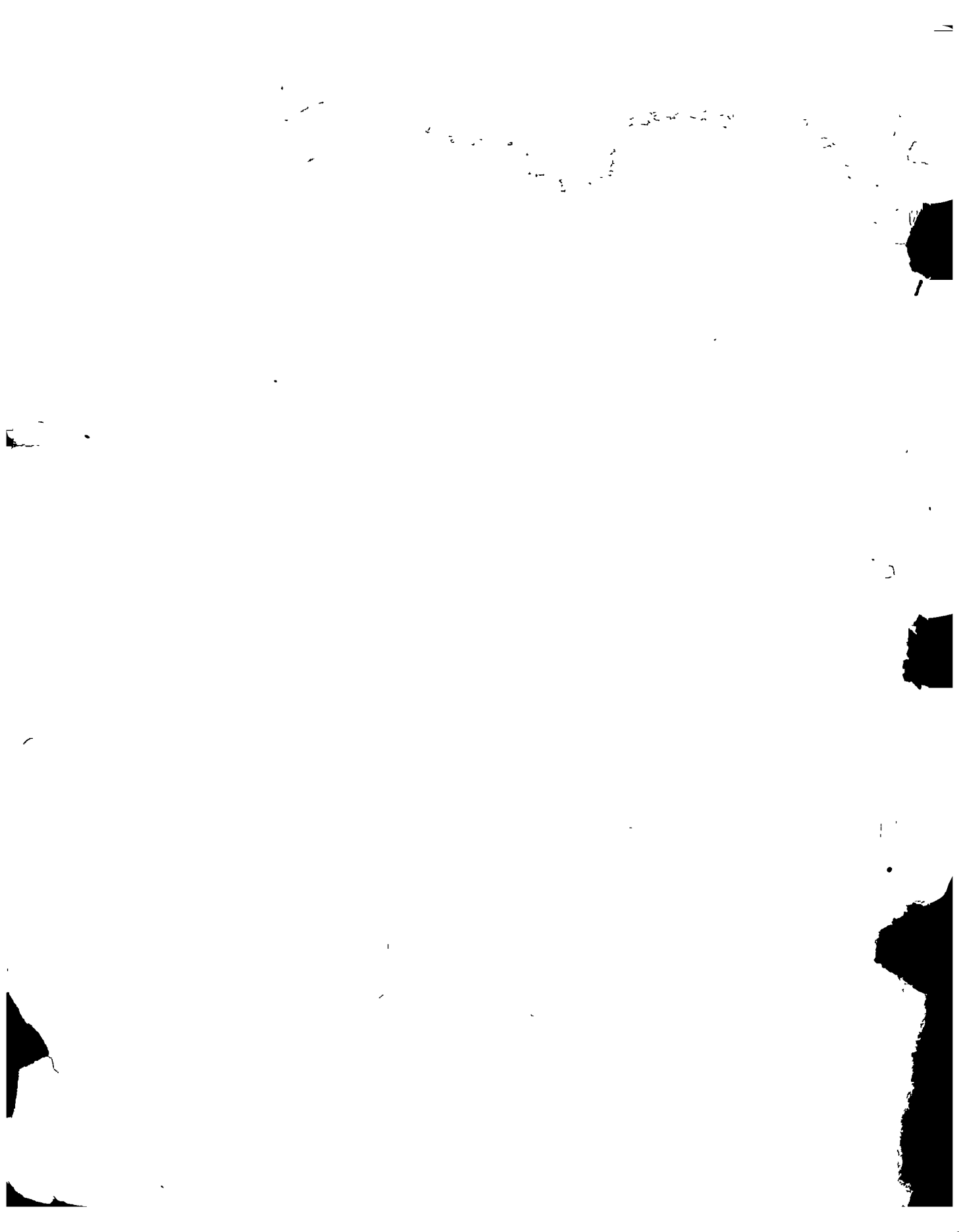
